Gloucester Rural District Council (Parish of Frampton-on-Severn) Public Path Diversion Order, 1971.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order made on the 25th May 1971, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Rural District Council of Gloucester.

Its effect will be to extinguish part of Footpath EFS.20 commencing at a point 120 yards east from the Barn at Watery Lane and running along the hedge of the field in an easterly direction for a distance of 200 yards to the buildings of Townfield Farm and thence in a northerly direction for a distance of 260 yards to its junction with footpath EFS.17, and to replace it with a new section of path starting at a point on EFS.19 30 yards north of the commencement point of the proposed extinguished portion of EFS.20 and running in a north-easterly direction across the field to a point on footpath EFS.17 8 yards west of the termination point of the proposed extinguishment detailed above.
