NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF EXTINGUISHMENT OF
PUBLIC RIGHT OF WAY ORDER

*Settle Rural District Council (Brow Side and
Kettlesbeck, Lawkland) Public Path Extinguishment
Order No. 2. 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th July 1972, the Settle Rural District Council confirmed the above named order.

Its effect is to extinguish the public right of way running from Stoops Gate in the parish of Austwick in a general southerly direction for a distance of 400 yards passing to the East of Stoops Barn crossing O.S. fields No. 10 and 11 and via a field gate into O.S. field No. 149 in the parish of Lawkland then at a point 30 yards West of Brow Side Farm (demolished) turning East across the site of such farm in O.S. field No. 148 through a field gate into O.S. field No. 144 crossing this in an easterly direction to a stile at the North-west corner of Sheephouse Plantation and East across O.S. field No. 141 leaving this through a field gate in its eastern boundary to enter O.S. field No. 139 turning then in a North-easterly direction along the North-west boundary of the latter field to an outbarn some 142 yards west of High Kettlesbeck farmhouse.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Settle between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative as from 1st August 1972, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may under Schedule 2 to the Act, as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within six weeks from 21st July 1972, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

*Settle Rural District Council (High Kettlesbeck,
Lawkland) Public Path Diversion Order No. 3, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on the 11th July 1972, the Settle Rural District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public right of way running from the north-east corner of O.S. field No. 151 southwards a distance of 235 yards to near an outbarn and then eastwards a distance of 142 yards to High Kettlesbeck farm thence turning north-eastwards a distance of 51 yards to a field gate at the north-west corner of O.S. field No. 156 to a new public right of way three feet in width starting on a line running from the same north-east corner of O.S. field No. 151 eastwards for a distance of 161 yards to a field gate into O.S. field No. 153 leading then southwards along the new farm road for 153 yards before turning south-east for some 35 yards to cross a stile into the south-west corner of O.S. field No. 157 then along the south and western boundary of that field for a distance of 22 and 12 yards respectively to a field gate into O.S. field No. 156 there to rejoin path No. 13.

The old path will be closed as from the 2nd August 1972.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Clerk's Department, Town Hall, Settle between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Monday to Friday.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

*Borough of Southwold (Golf Course Path (F.P.4)
Public Path Diversion Order 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on the 11th July 1972 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Southwold Borough Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way running in a westerly direction from a point 300 feet, or thereabouts, east of the site of the former metal footbridge which spanned the former railway cutting on The Common, Southwold, up to the eastern end of the site of the said former metal footbridge and a further section of the said footpath 80 feet in length, or thereabouts, formerly carried by the said former metal footbridge across the said cutting, to a line running south-westerly from the first point described above, for a distance of approximately 600 feet, or thereabouts, to a point on the south-east side of the former railway cutting, thence crossing the said cutting in a westerly direction to the west side, and thence turning in a north-westerly direction for a distance of 460 feet, or thereabouts, to rejoin the existing Footpath No. 4.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Southwold, between 8.30 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Town Clerk, Town Hall, Southwold, before the 21st August 1972 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Southwold Borough Council may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.

95 (Part)) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the Thurrock Urban District Council hereby give notice that the Urban District of Thurrock (Footpaths 92 and 95) Public Path Extinguishment Order 1971 is formally withdrawn and, in substitution therefor, the above-named Order, made on the 21st April 1972, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish the under-mentioned public rights of way:

- (a) the whole length of footpath 92 which commences at a point marked C on the map from Stanford Road (A.13) opposite footpath 82 and runs southwards for a distance of approximately
