

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Order and of the Map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge in the Director of Administration and Legal Services' Office of the Lambeth Town Hall, Brixton Hill, London S.W.2, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on Mondays to Thursday and 8.45 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Fridays during the period of 6 weeks from 16th August 1972.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

Information as to the effects of the Order, and as to the procedure to be followed in regard to the adaptation of heating appliances, may be obtained from the Directorate of Housing and Property Services (Smoke Control Inspectorate), Hambrook House (Second Floor), Porden Road, London, SW2 1RN (Tel. #### SCHEDULE

All that piece or parcel of land (with the buildings thereon) within the London Borough of Lambeth, having an area of 259.62 acres and being bounded on the:

*North.* By the centre line of Norwood High Street from its junction with Knight's Hill to its intersection by the South boundary of South Metropolitan Cemetery; by the South boundary of the South Metropolitan Cemetery by a line drawn from the Eastern end of the South boundary of the South Metropolitan Cemetery to the centre line of Carnac Street at its nearest point; by the centre line of Carnac Street and by Clive Passage. (South Metropolitan Cemetery is now known as West Norwood Cemetery and Crematorium.)

*On the East.* By the Borough's Eastern Boundary from its intersection by Clive Passage to its intersection by Westow Hill.

*On the South.* By the Borough's Southern Boundary from its intersection with Crystal Palace Parade to its intersection by Salters Hill.

*On the West.* By the centre line of Salters Hill from its junction with the Borough's Southern Boundary to its intersection by the railway line from Gipsy Hill Station; by the railway line from Gipsy Hill Station from its intersection by Salters Hill to its intersection by Gipsy Road; by the centre line of Gipsy Road from its intersection by the railway line from Gipsy Hill Station to its junction with Norwood High Street; by the centre line of Chapel Road; and by the centre line of Knight's Hill from its intersection by Chapel Road to its junction with Norwood High Street.

#### WEST BROMWICH COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

##### CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

##### *The County Borough of West Bromwich Smoke Control Order No. 22, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the County Borough of West Bromwich in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the above-mentioned Act on the 7th August 1972, made an Order entitled the County Borough of West Bromwich Smoke Control Order No. 22, 1972, declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1973 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment.

A copy of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, at the Town Hall, West Bromwich, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 21st August 1972.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may, by notice in writing to the Secretary of State, Department of the Environment, Queen Anne's Chambers Toothill Street, London, SW1H 9JY, object to the confirmation of the Order.

#### SCHEDULE

An area of approximately 16 acres situated within the County Borough of West Bromwich, bounded in the west by the British Rail (Midland Region), Wolverhampton—Walsall railway line from Crankhall Lane to Park Hill, and in the north, east and south by West Bromwich Smoke Control Area No. 21.

The following exemptions will apply to the Order:

*Class of Appliance to be exempted:* Solid fuel independent boilers having a rating of not less than 25,000 BTU/Hour, and used to provide central heating and hot water for domestic premises.

*Conditions of exemption:* Only authorised fuels, as declared by Regulations under the Clean Air Act 1956 and kindling sticks and paper shall be used in the fireplace.

## COAST PROTECTION ACT, 1949

### CYNGOR DOSBARTH GWLEDIG LLEYN LLEYN RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Rural District Council of Llyn acting in their capacity as Coast Protection Authority give notice under sub-section (i) of section (5) of the above Act that they propose to carry out coast protection works at Uwchmynydd Cliff, Aberdaron, as described herein.

- (1) The protection of the toe of cliff by means of a revetment using large rock rubble.
- (2) The grading and sowing of the cliffs.
- (3) The construction of a drain along the top of the cliff to remove surface water and a limited amount of drainage on the face of the cliff.
- (4) The construction of an access road from the top of the cliff at the Aberdaron end to the bottom of the cliff near the projecting corner by the river.
- (5) The total estimated cost of the work is approximately £110,000.

Any person may not later than the 11th September 1972, serve a written notice of objection to the above proposal on the Secretary of State and on the above-mentioned authority. Any such notice must contain a statement of the grounds of objection and must be sent by pre-paid post to the Secretary of State, The Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff, CF1 3NQ, and to the Clerk of the Authority at the address shown below.
