

(8) Abbey Road (north side) between Ramsden Square and Hindpool Road.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers ;  
(b) loading or unloading goods,

and, where necessary, in connection with:

- (c) the maintenance of the roads, and  
(d) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

The Order will provide that the Corporation may issue permits to allow residents in any of the above streets to park without time limit in their own street on a side where waiting is normally limited.

Full details of these proposals are in the draft Order which, together with a map showing the restricted areas and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at my offices during normal office hours.

#### BARROW-IN-FURNESS COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness (Michaelson Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 1st August 1972, the Council of the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order provides that the permitted waiting period in the lay-bys outside the entrances to Vickers Ltd. is reduced from 3 hours to 1½ hours but otherwise the existing provisions in Michaelson Road are unchanged.

It comes into force on the 2nd October 1972.

#### BARROW-IN-FURNESS COUNTY BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness Lawson Street (South) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1972*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Barrow-in-Furness propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

The effect of this Order is:

- (a) to prohibit waiting on any day other than a Sunday between Market Street and Cornwallis Street:

(i) at all times on the east side for 25 metres southward from the southern kerbline of Cornwallis Street and 10 metres northward from the northerly kerbline of Market Street.

(ii) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the remainder of the east side ;

(iii) at all times on the west side for 20 metres southward from the southern kerbline of Cornwallis Street and 10 metres northward from the northern kerbline of Market Street.

- (b) to limit waiting to 1 hour in any 3 hours 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Monday to Saturday on west side from 10 metres north of the northern kerbline of Market Street to a point 20 metres south of the southern kerbline of Cornwallis Street.

#### BRAINTREE AND BOCKING URBAN DISTRICT COUNCIL

*The Urban District Council of Braintree and Bocking (High Street) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1972.*

The Order shall come into force on the 11th August 1972.
