TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

- The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 25th August 1972, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bill Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £120,000,000.
- The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Tuesday 29th August 1972, to Friday the 1st September 1972, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.
- The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the person whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payments in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.
- Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.
- The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, to authorise the stopping-up of those lengths of highway specified in the attached Schedule to enable redevelopment to be carried out in accordance with a planning permission granted by Glamorgan County Council under Part III of that Act.

The proposed Order will require the provision of new highways maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Port Talbot Borough Council.

During 28 days from the 17th August 1972, copies of the draft Order and relevant plan may be inspected at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Port Talbot Borough Council, Municipal Buildings, Port Talbot, and may be obtained free of charge from the Secretary of State (quoting reference R15/274/5) at the address stated below.

Within the above mentioned period of 28 days any person may by notice to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division, (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd), Graham Buildings, 139 Newport Road, Cardiff CF2 1YU (quoting the reference R15/274/5) object to the making of the Order.

SCHEDULE

Description of highways to be stopped-up. (The distances are approximate.) The highways to be stopped-up are in the Borough of Port Talbot in the County of Glamorgan. They are shown by zebra hatchings on the deposited plan and are:

- That length of road known as Church Street, which extends from the north-east side of the main railway line to the south-west side of its junction with Albert Terrace, a distance of 113 yards;
- That length of road, known as Church Place, which extends from its junction with Church Street
