*The Trunk Road (Picton House Bridge, Llanddowror) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1972*

Notice is hereby given that by reason of the likelihood of danger to the public and of serious damage to the highway, the Secretary of State has made an Order under section 12 (1) and (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is that no person shall cause any vehicle to proceed in that length of the St. Clears—Nash (South Pembrokeshire) Trunk Road (A477) which is carried by the Picton House Bridge at Llanddowror in the county of Carmarthen.

The alternative route which is available for vehicles not exceeding 14 feet 2 inches in height is from St. Clears in a westerly direction along the A40 to Whitland, thence in a general southerly direction along the B4328 to Tavernspite, thence in a south-easterly direction along the B4314 to join the A477 at Red Roses, and vice-versa.

The alternative route available for vehicles exceeding 14 feet 2 inches in height is from Llanddowror in a westerly direction along an unclassified road to Tavernspite, thence in a south-easterly direction along the B4314 to join the A477 at Red Roses, and vice-versa. Vehicles with wide loads using this alternative route should first contact the police, as an escort may be necessary.
