### DEPARTMENT OF EMPLOYMENT

#### THE POWER PRESSES (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS 1972

The Secretary of State for Employment hereby gives notice that on 9th October 1972 he made the Power Presses (Amendment) Regulations 1972 under powers contained in the Factories Act 1961.

Regulation 5 of the Power Presses Regulations 1965 requires the examination and testing by a competent person in specified circumstances of power presses and safety devices on power presses used in factories and electrical stations. Regulation 6 (1) requires the competent person, where the examination and test discloses certain defects, to send written notification to the occupier of the factory or electrical station.

The amending Regulations require that where such notification has been sent to the occupier, the competent person shall send to the inspector for the district a copy of the report of the examination and test under Regulation 5 within 14 days of the completion of the examination and test.
