HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The Chester—Bangor Trunk Road (Chester Southerly By-Pass (Broughton to South-East of Bretton Section, Side Roads)) Order, 1972.

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that, in relation to the new trunk road to be constructed by him between Broughton and Bretton in the County of Flintshire he has made an Order under section 9 of (a) to authorise him:

> (i) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter highways;
