

THE CITY AND COUNTY BOROUGH OF CARDIFF

The City and County Borough of Cardiff (Maindy Road/Minister Street/Fanny Street/Mundy Place) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972.

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th November 1972, the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order which makes it unlawful to cause your vehicle to wait, subject to certain exceptions in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice will come into operation on the 10th November 1972.

A copy of the Order and the map showing the restricted area are available at the address given below, where they may be examined during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the 7th November 1972, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of road in the City and Borough of Cardiff

- (1) *Maindy Road*, the north-east side between its junction with Minister Street and a point 65 feet north-west of that junction.
- (2) *Minister Street*, both sides between its junction with Maindy Road and a point 75 feet east of that junction.
- (3) *Fanny Street*, both sides between its junction with Catherine Street and a point 50 feet north-east of that junction.
- (4) *Mundy Place*, both sides between its junction with Woodville Road and a point 50 feet south-east of that junction.

The City and County Borough of Cardiff (Crwys Road) (Limited Waiting) Order 1972

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th November 1972, the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

This Order which comes into effect on the 10th November 1972 prohibits, subject to certain exceptions, the leaving of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays, Crwys Road:

- (a) on the north-east side thereof between a point 500 feet north-west of its junction with Mackintosh Place and a point 740 feet north-west of that junction on those days of the month which bear even numbers; or
- (b) on the south-west side thereof, between a point 640 feet north-west of its junction with Richmond Road and a point 780 feet north-west of that junction on those days of the month which bear odd numbers.

On the side that waiting will be permitted it will be restricted to 1 hour in any period of 2 hours.

Should you wish to question the validity of this Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of

any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order you may, within 6 weeks from the 7th November 1972, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Cardiff City and County Borough Council (Moorland Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Variation) Order, 1972.

Notice is hereby given that on the 7th November 1972, the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

Cardiff City and County Borough Council (Newport Road and Queen Street) (Experimental Prohibition of Driving) Order.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the City and County Borough of Cardiff propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act, 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act, 1968.

When this Order comes into effect you will not be allowed to drive your vehicle between the hours of 8.15 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 5 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays upon certain lengths of the inner lane on the southern side of Newport Road and Queen Street. This will provide a "Reserve Bus Lane" to facilitate the movement of stage and express carriage services.
