

Definitive Maps and Statements previously prepared by them for the County of Worcester, now hereby give notice that they have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Revised Map and Statement they have prepared in draft form showing rights of way in the County subsisting on 1st January 1968 (the date of review), by:

- (1) the addition of certain footpaths and bridleways, otherwise than consequent upon Statutory Orders, in the Borough of Evesham and the Parishes of Powick and Upton upon Severn (Upton upon Severn Rural District), Broome and Chaddesley Corbett (Kidderminster Rural District), Himbleton, Huddington and North Claines (Droitwich Rural District), Throckmorton and Upton Snodsbury (Pershore Rural District), and Leigh (Martley Rural District);
- (2) the addition, variation or deletion of certain footpaths and bridleways consequent upon Statutory Orders made before 1st January 1968, but not included in the Draft Revised Map, in the Boroughs of Halesowen and Stourbridge, the Urban Districts of Bromsgrove and Malvern, and the Parishes of Bredon and Hill and Moor (Pershore Rural District), Hindlip (Droitwich Rural District), and Stoke Prior (Bromsgrove Rural District).

Anglesey County Council (Footpath Number 11 Llanddona) Public Path Diversion Order, 1972

Notice is hereby given that on the 22nd November 1972 the Anglesey County Council, confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert a section of Footpath Number 11 situate at Cae Maes Mawr in the Parish of Llanddona and commencing from a point 66 yards north of the County Highway O.R. 206 proceeding in a northerly direction for 30 yards and then in a north-easterly direction for 26 yards.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the Clerk of the Anglesey County Council, Shire Hall, Llangefni and at the offices of the Clerk of the Aethwy Rural District Council, Council Offices, Llanfairpwll, during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from the 22nd November 1972 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provisions contained therein, on the ground that

it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 1st December 1972 make an application for the purpose to the Court.

NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

COUNTRYSIDE ACT, 1968

The Blyth Rural District Council (Kelsale Footpath 31 (Part) and Theberton Footpath 2) Public Path Diversion Order 1972.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 20th November 1972 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Blyth Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modifications will be to divert:

(a) that part of the public right of way (being Footpath No. 31 in the Parish of Kelsale) running from a point in the south-east corner of Enclosure O.S. 534 for a total distance of approximately 325 yards firstly in an easterly direction along the southern boundaries of Enclosure O.S. 531, O.S. 526, continuing in a northerly direction along the access track to Peakhill Farm and thence (from the point in Enclosure O.S. 527 where the track turns in a westerly direction towards the farm) continuing in an easterly direction to terminate at a point on the Kelsale—Theberton parish boundary to a line commencing from the said point in the south-east corner of Enclosure O.S. 534 and running firstly in a northerly direction along the eastern boundary of the said O.S. 534 for a distance of approximately 65 yards thence in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 176 yards along the access track through Enclosure O.S. 527 passing between two barns and two ponds and to the south of Peakhill Farm to the point where the access track turns in a southerly direction (towards the Kelsale—Theberton road) and thence in a northerly direction traversing Enclosure O.S. 527 and running along the eastern boundary of Enclosure O.S. 528 for a distance of approximately 188 yards to terminate at a point on the eastern boundary of the said Enclosure O.S. 528 on the Kelsale—Theberton parish boundary adjacent to the south-west corner of Ashen Spring Wood, Theberton.

(b) Footpath No. 2 Theberton commencing from a point on the Kelsale—Theberton parish boundary (adjacent to the termination point of the existing route of Footpath No. 31 Kelsale referred to above) and running in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 310 yards along the northern boundary of Enclosure O.S. 35 Theberton to terminate in the north-east corner of that enclosure adjacent to the Kelsale—Theberton road to a line commencing from a point on the Kelsale—Theberton parish boundary in the north-west corner of O.S. 34 (adjacent to the termination point of the proposed route of Footpath No. 31 Kelsale) in a generally easterly direction along the northern boundary of Enclosure O.S. 34, Theberton for a total distance of approximately 490 yards to terminate at a point in the north-east corner of that enclosure adjacent to the Kelsale—Theberton road.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Rendham Road, Saxmundham, Suffolk, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays Mondays to Fridays, inclusive.
