The QUEEN has been pleased to issue an Amending Warrant under Her Majesty's Royal Sign Manual to the following effect:

ELIZABETH R.

ELIZABETH THE SECOND, BY THE GRACE OF GOD OF THE UNITED KINGDOM OF GREAT BRITAIN AND NORTHERN IRELAND AND OF HER OTHER REALMS AND TERRITORIES QUEEN, HEAD OF THE COMMONWEALTH, DEFENDER OF THE FAITH, TO ALL TO WHOM THESE PRESENTS SHALL COME, GREETING!

WHEREAS Our Royal Father His late Majesty King George the Sixth in consideration of the good services rendered by members of the Police Forces and of Fire Brigades in Our Colonies and in Territories under Our Protection did by Warrant under His Royal Sign Manual dated the tenth day of May, one thousand nine hundred and thirty-eight, institute a new Medal to be awarded for such services as aforesaid:

AND WHEREAS We deem it expedient that the said Warrant shall be amended to provide that recipients of the said Medal shall be entitled to use the appropriate initials after their names;

NOW THEREFORE We do by these Presents for Us, Our Heirs and Successors ordain and appoint that the said Warrant shall be amended as follows:

- (1) Clauses Fifthly, Sixthly, Seventhly, Eighthly and Ninthly of the said Warrant shall be re-numbered as Clauses Sixthly, Seventhly, Eighthly, Ninthly and Tenthly respectively.
- (2) The following shall be inserted after Clause Fourthly of the said Warrant:

"*Fifthly*: It is ordained that a recipient of the Medal may, on all occasions when the use of such letters is customary, place after his or her name the letters 'C.P.M.'"

Given at Our Court at Saint James's this twenty-fifth day of October, one thousand nine hundred and seventy-two in the twenty-first year of Our Reign.
