- (d) Schedule III between 7 a.m., and 6 p.m., on Mondays to Saturdays both inclusive for a longer period than 2 hours.

There are special "No waiting" provisions for Bishop Street, particularly on Wednesdays and Saturdays (market days). Right turns are prohibited between roads mentioned in Schedule IV.

Vehicles will only be permitted to be driven in one direction in the roads mentioned in Schedule V with an exception for buses in a segregated part of Bishopton Lane.

No vehicles can be driven between one road mentioned in Schedule VI and VII and the road mentioned opposite to it in those said Schedules.

No vehicles can be driven in parts of Dovecot Street, Middle Street, East Street, Lawson Street, Webster Street, Manfield Street* and the unnamed road linking John Street at its junction with Union Square and John Street at its junction with Mill Street West. Vehicles proceeding North in Longley Street shall, on reaching the junction with Parliament Street, make a left turn only.

Exceptions will permit waiting for the purposes of:

(a) Loading or unloading goods in roads mentioned in Schedule I, Part II and Schedule II Part I but not between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. and also in Schedule I Part III and Schedule II Part II but not between 7 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m. and in Schedule I Part IV, Schedule II Part IV and Schedule III at any time;

and where necessary

- (b) For Post Office vehicles;
- (c) Picking up and setting down passengers;
- (d) Road Maintenance;
- (e) Statutory Undertakers works or vehicles carrying out other statutory duties;
- (f) Invalid carriages;
- (g) To take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and also for exceptions to certain "one way" provisions for fire service vehicles and cleansing department vehicles.
