- (d) To limit the waiting of vehicles to not more than 1 hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on the lengths of roads in Oundle specified in Schedule 2 to this notice.
- (e) To limit the waiting of vehicles to not more than 30 minutes between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on the lengths of roads in Oundle specified in Schedule 3 to this notice.
- (f) To prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays on the lengths of roads in Oundle specified in Schedule 4 to this notice.
