The Trunk Road (Castle Street, Cardigan) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. in that length of the Fishguard—Aberystwyth—Dolgellau—Caernarvon—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (A.487), known as Castle Street, at Cardigan in the County of Cardigan, which extends from the southern end of Cardigan Bridge in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 267 yards.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein;
