*The County of Northampton (Parish of Old—Footpath DF.3) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973*

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th February 1973 the Northamptonshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is (a) to stop up the two spurs of public footpath DF.3 in the parish of Old, 180 yards and 200 yards in length crossing OS.4639 in a north-westerly direction from the junction with public footpath DF.9; and (b) to provide an alternative route along the south-western and western perimeter of OS.4639 for a distance of 308 yards.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at the offices of the Clerk of the Brixworth Rural District Council, Council Offices, Brixworth, and at my office and may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours.

This Order becomes operative as from the date on which it is certified by the Northamptonshire County Council that the alternative footpath has been provided but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within six weeks from the 27th February 1973, make application for the purpose to the High Court.
