The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under section 3 (6) and 13, of the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz: The Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 4) Order 1973.

This Order amends the Import Duties (Temporary Exemptions) (No. 3) Order 1973 so as to prevent the coming into effect of an exemption from import duty in respect of diisocyanatotoluene, mixed isomers, containing not more than 70 per cent. by weight of 2,4 diisocyanatotoluene.

The Order comes into operation on 28th February 1973 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1973 No. 300.

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 9th March 1973, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bill Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £140,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 12th March 1973, to Friday, the 16th March 1973 inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
