The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by Orders in Council dated 7th November 1924 and 25th June 1925, as amended by subsequent Orders, regulations were approved for the payment of pensions and allowances by the Ministry of Defence to widows, children and parents of members of the naval forces who die as the result of peace time service before 3rd September 1939 at similar rates and subject to similar conditions as awards payable by the Department of Health and Social Security in respect of deaths attributable to service during the 1914 World War or after 2nd September 1939:

And whereas the Department of Health and Social Security have made further provision concerning pensions and allowances payable to dependants of members of the naval forces:

And whereas it is expedient that corresponding improvements should be made in the awards payable by the Ministry of Defence:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 11 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

- 1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Widows' Attributable Pensions) Order 1973.
- 2. The revised rates and conditions of award of pensions and allowances to widows and children in respect of the death of officers and men of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines where death is attributable to their service as specified in the Schedule annexed hereto shall take effect from the dates indicated in the said Schedule.

SCHEDULE

SECTION 1

PENSIONS AND ALLOWANCES

1. Widows (a) Pensions shall be payable at the discretion of the Defence Council, and subject to the regulations following, to the widows of officers, ratings and marines whose deaths are attributable to service before 4th August 1914 or between 1st October 1921 and 2nd September 1939.

(b) Where a pension is awarded to a widow for any past period the total amount of pension so awarded may be abated by the amount by which the amount of benefit paid exceeds what would have been payable for that period had the pension been

concurrently payable.

2. Definition of Rank

- (a) Officers:
- (1) For the purpose of assessing pensions of officers' widows the rank of the officer shall be, except as hereinafter provided, the highest substantive rank held by the officer on the Active List or while re-employed in a service capacity during war or emergency.
- (2) Brevet or honorary rank shall not count, except where otherwise specially stated, but the rank of Commodore 1st or 2nd Class shall be regarded as substantive rank. Brevet rank held on the Active List prior to 25th June 1925 shall also be regarded as a substantive rank.
- also be regarded as a substantive rank.

 (3) If an officer accepts a temporary rank lower than his substantive rank and dies in circumstances rendering his widow eligible for an attributable pension, his widow shall not receive a pension greater than the rate appropriate to her husband's temporary rank, unless eligible for a higher Service pension appropriate to his substantive rank.

 (4) A Chaplain shall be treated as holding such rank as is, in the opinion of the Defence Council, appropriate in his case having regard to his length of service. In the case of a Chaplain on the retired list seniority for this purpose shall be taken as seniority at date of original retirement increased by the amount of actual service (if any) after retirement during war or emergency.

 (b) R.N. Ratings and R.M. Other Ranks:
- For the purpose of assessing pensions of the widows of ratings and other ranks, the rank shall be that held by the deceased rating or other rank prior to the termination of his full pay service.

3. Rent Allowance

A widow who is in receipt of a pension for herself and has a child in her care may be granted a rent allowance at a rate not exceeding:

- £3.00 a week from 22nd September 1971
- £3.40 a week from 4th October 1972
- as the Defence Council may consider appropriate, having regard to her weekly rent and rates.

For the purpose of this clause

- (a) "child" means a child who is eligible for an allowance under clause 16 and any other child who, in the opinion of the Defence Council, having regard to the child's relationship to or connection with the deceased member and the other
- circumstances of the case, should be treated as covered by this provision;

 (b) "weekly rent and rates" means such sum as the Defence Council may, after taking into account all relevant factors and making all necessary apportionments, consider to be the weekly amount in respect of rent, or the equivalent thereof,
- and rates, which the widow is paying or providing either directly or indirectly for accommodation for the benefit of herself and the child;

 (c) "accommodation" means living accommodation without any service or benefit not ordinarily provided by the landlord to the tenant of an unfurnished dwelling house, but may include accommodation reasonably required for the storage of furniture.

Where an allowance under this clause would cease by reason of the death of a child, the allowance may be continued for the period of 13 weeks from the date of the child's death.

8. Education Allowance

In addition to an allowance under Clauses 5, 6 or 7 an allowance not exceeding £120.00 a year may be granted for the purpose of the child's education, provided:

(a) the child has reached the age of 5 years,
(b) the circumstances of the family are such as to require it, and

(c) in the opinion of the Defence Council the type of education which the child is receiving or is to receive is suitable for the child.

(a) If the death of an officer, seaman or marine is accepted as attributable to Service, his parent or parents may be granted an allowance subject to such conditions as the Defence Council may determine, provided that:

1) he did not leave a widow or eligible child, and

(2) that the parent or parents are in pecuniary need by reason of having reached the age of not less than 65 years in the case of a man, or 60 years in the case of a woman, or infirmity or other adverse condition which is not merely of a temporary character. In determining whether an award shall be made, account will be taken of the extent to which the serviceman was supporting his parents at the time of his death, and the extent to which, if he had not died, he would have been likely, in the opinion of the Defence Council, to support them.

(b) The rate of allowance shall be at the discretion of the Defence Council but shall not exceed:

In the case of officers the greater of either:

(1) the ordinary rate of widow's pension under the Regulations in force on 25th September 1949, or (2)(1) where there are two parents, £100.00 a year for Commissioned Officers (including Senior Commissioned Officers (Branch List)) or £85.00 a year for Commissioned Officers (Branch List) other than Senior Commissioned Officers, or (ii) in single parent cases, the maximum rates are £75.00 and £60.00 a year.

Provided that, in exceptional cases, the rate of the pension may be increased in excess of the rates given in sub-paragraph (b)(2) above by a sum not exceeding £20.00 a year.

In the case of ratings and marines the rate shall not exceed £1.38 a week where there are two parents and £1.00 a week in single parent cases.

Provided that, in exceptional cases, this rate may be increased by a sum not exceeding £0.62 a week where there are two parents and £0.38 a week in single parent cases.

(c) A grant shall not be transferable but, if an award has been made to the two parents, payment of the pension may be continued to the survivor at such rate as the Defence Council may determine.

(d) A grant shall cease on the remarriage of the grantee.

SECTION II

CONDITIONS GOVERNING THE AWARD

10. Pension cannot be claimed as a right

(a) A pension cannot be claimed as a right and will not be granted or continued when the applicant is shown to be living with a man as his wife, nor will it be granted if the service of the officer, rating or marine has not been such as in the opinion of the Defence Council to justify the award.

(b) If the death of an officer, rating or marine, or the wound, injury or disease which resulted in his death was due wholly

or in part to his own negligence or misconduct or to any cause within his own control, any grant which might otherwise be made to his widow or other dependants may be withheld or reduced in amount at the discretion of the Defence Council.

(c) If the applicant is granted any other pension or allowance from public funds on account of the service of the deceased, any pension which might otherwise be granted under this Schedule may be withheld or reduced as the Defence Council may determine.

11. Third Party Compensation

If an officer, rating or marine is killed or dies in such circumstances that any grant is payable in respect of him under this Order in Council and his widow, child or other dependant relative received compensation from or on behalf of a third party for the act, omission or circumstances which caused the death, any such compensation may be taken into consideration in assessing any grant which might be made under this Order in Council; and if the compensation is received after assessment, it may be taken into consideration and the assessment may be amended or cancelled.

12. Effect of Separation on Widow's Pension

Subject to any exception which the Defence Council may approve in a particular case, a pension will not be awarded to a widow who was separated from her husband at the time of his death. Should such an exception be approved the award will be at such a rate, and subject to such conditions, as the Defence Council may determine.

13. Date of commencement of pension

The date of commencement of pension will be determined according to the circumstances of the case and will normally, if application is not unduly delayed, be the date following the date of cessation of the husband's disablement pension.

14. Belated claims

If a widow dies before establishing her claim to pension, arrears of pension will not, save in exceptional circumstances, be allowed to her estate.

15. Remarriage

If a widow of a rating or marine who has been granted a pension under these regulations remarries, her pension will cease

on the date of her remarnage, but at the discretion of the Defence Council, she may then be granted a gratuity equal to one years pension in full discharge of all claims.

The pension of an officer's widow who remarries shall be suspended from the date following that of her remarriage, but in the event of her again becoming a widow her pension may be restored in whole or in part at the discretion of the Defence Council for such time as she remains a widow, provided that she is otherwise qualified and that her pecuniary circumstances are such as in the opinion of the Defence Council, justify the award. Should she become eligible by remarriage for a pension at a different rate, she may be awarded that which is more to her advantage.

16. Children

(a) A "child" for the purposes of the award of a pension under this Schedule means:

(1) A legitimate child of the Officer, R.N. rating or R.M. other rank; or (2) a step-child of the Officer, R.N. Rating or R.M. other rank who was mainly dependent on him at the time of his death;

(3) a child adopted by the Officer, R.N. rating or R.M. other rank; or
(4) an illegitimate child of the Officer, R.N. rating or R.M. other rank, born before or within nine months after the date on which he sustained the wound or injury, or the date on which he was removed from duty on account of the disease in respect of which his disablement pension was granted, and who was regularly maintained by the officer, rating or other rank up to the date of his death, or who was the subject of an affiliation order which was in force at the date of his death.

- (b) A child's pension will normally cease when the child attains the age of 18 years in the case of the child of an Officer or a Regimental Sergeant Major, Royal Marines, or the age of 16 years in the case of all other ratings and ranks, but may be granted or continued after those ages:

 - (1) if the child continues to receive full-time education, or is an apprentice not receiving more than nominal wages; or (2) if, before attaining the age referred to above the child was, and continues to be afflicted by mental or bodily infirmity and is therefore incapable of earning his, or her own living, provided the Defence Council considers that the pecuniary circumstances of the child and family are such as to justify the award.
- (c) Children's pensions will be paid to the widow or mother of the child, or other person responsible for the child's maintenance, or to the child direct, as may be decided by the Defence Council.

(d) Pensions of children of Officers and of Regimental Sergeant Majors, Royal Marines, may be issued quarterly in advance (e) Children's allowances will not be payable for any period during which the children are maintained in the Royal Navy the Army or the Royal Air Force.

Whereas it is expedient to provide for the increase of certain pensions granted in respect of service in Her Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces to correspond, as nearly as may be, with the benefits provided, in the case of civil pensions, by the Pensions (Increase) Act 1971 (1971 c. 56.);

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865 (1865 c. 73.) and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions (Pensions Increase) Order 1973.

- Interpretation
 2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63.) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpreta-General
 - 3. The provisions contained in the Schedule to this Order shall have effect from 1st September 1971.

SCHEDULE

SECTION I

1. A pension to which this Order relates shall be:

(a) Officers service retired pay, compassionate allowances and the service portion of disability retired pay.
(b) Service retired pay and the service portion of disability retired pay of officers of the Women's Royal Naval Service and of Queen Alexandra's Royal Naval Nursing Service and Nursing Service Reserve and of the Naval Nursing Auxiliary

- (c) Men's and women's service pension, including elements for rank and age and additions for war service.
 (d) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 23rd May 1952 and previous Orders relating to Riggers and Yardcraft
- e) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 20th November 1959, and previous Orders relating to European and Indian members of the Hong Kong Dockyard Police.
- (f) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 20th November 1959, and previous Orders relating to European and Indian (or otherwise Asian) members of the Singapore Dockyard Police.

 Pensions payable under Order in Council of 23rd May 1952, and previous Orders relating to certain Shipwrights.

- (i) Pensions payable titude of the Council of 2510 Way 1952, and previous Orders relating to certain Shipwrights.
 (i) Pensions for distinguished conduct. (Additions to pensions in respect of gallantry awards shall for the purposes of this Order be regarded as forming parts of the pensions to which they are attached.)
 (j) Meritorious service annuities payable to Royal Marines when the recipient is also receiving another pension increasable
- under this Order.

(k) Retired Officers' Naval pensions and good service pensions.

Any award increased or increasable under Orders in Council of 13th August 1920 or 8th December 1924.

(m) Pensions payable under Order in Council of 27th February 1961 and previous Orders relating to Officers of the Royal Fleet Auxiliary Service

(n) Service retired pay of Officers of the former Royal Indian Navy.

SECTION II

2. A pension to which this Order relates may be increased provided either that:

(a) the pensioner has attained the age of 60 years or, where the pension is a widow's pension, 40 years; or (b) the pensioner, if receiving a pension as a child of a deceased officer, rating or other rank, has not attained the age of 16 years or, having attained that age, is receiving full time instruction in an educational establishment or is undergoing training for a trade, profession or vocation in circumstances that require him to devote the whole of his time to that training for a period of not less than two years; or (c) the pensioner was invalided from naval service other than re-employed service; or

(d) the pensioner is a woman with at least one dependant as defined in paragraph 13 hereafter; or

- (e) the pensioner is permanently incapacitated by physical or mental infirmity from engaging in regular full-time employment.
- 3. Subject to the provisions of paragraph 4, the increase shall comprise the appropriate percentage as set out in paragraph 5 hereafter of the retured pay or pension being paid to the pensioner at the time when the increase becomes payable, including any pension increase awarded or for which he may become eligible under former Pensions Increase Orders in Council.
- 4. In implementing the provisions of paragraph 3 thereof a fraction of a pound in an annual rate of pension shall be treated as a whole pound and up to 31st March 1969, a fraction of a sixpence in a weekly rate of pension shall be treated as a whole sixpence. From 1st April 1969 the increase shall be calculated on the actual pension in payment. The increases shall be added to the actual pension in payment.
 - 5. Except in the case of widows and children awards may be increased as follows:
 - (a) If the pension was assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced before 1st April 1969, the awards at 1st April 1969, including any pension increase awarded to a pensioner or for which he may become eligible under former Pensions Increase Measures and including any part of the pension commuted before 1st April 1969, will be compared with the basic award plus a percentage increase in accordance with paragraph 6 hereafter and less any portion commuted before 1st April 1969, adjusted as in paragraph 8 hereafter.

 (b) Any amount commuted during the period 1st April 1969 to 31st March 1971 will be deducted from the greater of the two totals referred to in paragraph (a) and 18 per cent. will be added to the remainder; any amount commuted after 31st March 1971 will then be deducted;

(c) If the pension was assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1969

and were in force before 1st April 1970, the basic rate less any portion commuted prior to 1st April 1971, will be increased by 18 per cent.; any portion commuted after 31st March 1971 will then be deducted;

(d) If the pension was assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations introduced after 31st March 1970 the basic rate less any portion commuted prior to 1st April 1971 will be increased by 12 per cent. from the effective date of subsequent regulations, or from 1st September 1971 whichever is the later, any portion commuted after 31st March 1971 will then be deducted.

(e) If the pension was assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations introduced after 31st December 1970 the basic rate less any portion commuted prior to 1st April 1971 will be increased by 6 per cent. from the effective date of subsequent regulations or from 1st September 1971 whichever is the later, any portion commuted after 31st March 1971

will then be deducted.

6. The appropriate percentage increases referred to in paragraph 5(a) will be as follows:

500 per cent. for awards assessed in accordance with regulations which were in force before 1st April 1919.

- (b) 205.2 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1919 and were in force before 19th December 1945.
- (c) 134.8 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 18th December 1945 and were in force before 1st September 1950.
- (d) 105.9 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st August 1950 and were in force before 1st April 1956.
- (e) 50.1 per cent. for:
 - (1) Awards to women officers and ratings assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1956 and were in force before 1st April 1959;

 (2) Awards to male officers assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st

March 1956 and were in force before 1st April 1960:

- (3) Officers service retired pay assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1956 and were in force before 1st April 1959 and which provided for service retired pay at a rate equal to service pension as a rating with an addition for having held commissioned rank.
- (f) 39.7 per cent. for:
 - (1) Awards to women officers assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1959 and were in force before 1st April 1960;

 - (2) Awards to ratings assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1959 and were in force before 1st April 1962, whether or not the awards were made before the latter date.
 (3) Awards to officers assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1959 and were in force before 1st April 1962 and which provided for service retired pay at a rate equal to pension for a Warrant Officer Class I with additions.
- (g) 38.3 per cent. awards to officers assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1960 and were in force before 1st April 1962, whether or not the awards were made before the latter date.
- (h) 28.2 per cent, for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1962 and were in force before 1st April 1964.
- (i) 21.8 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1964 and were in force before 1st April 1966.
- (j) 11.8 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1966 and were in force before 1st April 1968.
- (k) 4.2 per cent. for awards assessed or re-assessed in accordance with regulations which were introduced after 31st March 1968 and were in force before 1st April 1969.
- 7. Awards in accordance with regulations which were in force before 19th December 1945 and which were re-assessed for 1939-45 war service will be increased by the addition of 205 2 per cent. to the basic award, excluding the element for 1939-45 war service.
- 8. For the purpose of paragraph 5 any portion of pension commuted prior to 1st April 1969 will be adjusted by the percentage shown in the table below:

- 9. Awards to widows at 31st August 1971 will be adjusted as follows:
- (a) In the case of a widow whose husband's last day of service was prior to 31st March 1969, the following figures will be compared:
 - The award at 31st August 1971;
 - (2) The appropriate fraction of the husband's basic award as increased in accordance with paragraphs 6 or 7; and the greater taken. 18 per cent, will be added to this greater figure.

- (b) In the case of a widow whose husband's last day of service was after 30th March 1969 and before 31st March 1970, 18 per cent. will be added to an existing award.
- (c) In the case of a widow whose husband's last day of service was after 30th March 1970 and whose award is based upon regulations which were effective from 1st April 1970, 12 per cent. will be added to an existing award from the effective date of subsequent regulations or from 1st September 1971 whichever is the later.
- (d) In the case of a widow whose husband's last day of service was after 30th December 1970 and whose award is based upon regulations which were effective from 1st January 1971, 6 per cent. will be added to an existing award from the effective date of subsequent regulations or from 1st September 1971 whichever is the later.

 (e) Similar action will be taken in the case of children, and widows under 40 years of age, except that they will not be eligible for the increases mentioned at paragraph 9(a), (b), (c) or (d), nor that at paragraph 10 unless one of the conditions at paragraph 2(b), (d) or (e) is satisfied
- paragraph 2(b), (d) or (e) is satisfied.

 (f) This paragraph does not apply to widows of Admirals of the Fleet.
- 10. 18 per cent, will be added to minimum rates of family pensions.
- 11. (a) For the purposes of paragraphs 5, 9 and 10 it will be assumed that pensioners (excluding children other than those whose pensions are awarded or continued on grounds of incapacity) have reached the age of 70 at 31st March 1969.

 - (a) the service retired pay earned by service on the active list increased in accordance with the general conditions by the pensions increases, including the increase provided for in this Order, applicable to the retired pay code under which this element of retired pay was awarded; plus
 (b) the additional retired pay earned by service in the salaried appointment increased in accordance with the general conditions by the Pensions (Increase) Act 1971, applicable to a civil pension commencing on the date of final retirement.
- 16. The pensions specified at sub-paragraphs (d), (e), (f), (g) and (m) of paragraph 1 of this Order may be increased only by the extent to which a corresponding award under the Superannuation Acts would have been increasable under the Pensions (Increase) Act 1971.
- 17. Any general condition attaching to the grant or continuance of a pension shall apply also to the grant or continuance of any increase to that pension.
- 18. (a) to create a bus lane on the south-east side of Piccadilly (to operate in a south-westerly direction) and to prohibit all vehicles from entering or proceeding in that bus lane;

(b) to create a bus lane on the south-west side of Regent Street (to operate in a north-westerly direction) near its junction with Piccadilly and to prohibit all motor vehicles from entering or proceeding in that bus lane except licensed cabs and vehicles requiring access to or leaving any premises abutting the bus lane or accessible only therefrom;

(c) to prohibit all vehicles from entering or proceeding

(1) the carriageway which lies on the south-east side of the island site on which stands the Shaftesbury Memorial;

(2) the carriageways which lie between the north-easternmost and south-easternmost island sites and between the north-westernmost and south-westernmost island sites situated opposite the junction of Piccadilly and St. James's Street.

The prohibitions referred to above will not apply to:

(i) a stage or express carriage on a scheduled service;

(ii) a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance police purposes if it is reasonably necessary for that vehicle to enter a bus lane;

(vi) anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;

(vii) any vehicle which enters the Piccadilly bus lane from any part of Piccadilly which does not comprise the bus lane at a point opposite the junction of Picca-dilly and Duke Street if that vehicle forthwith enters Duke Street;

(d) to suspend the provisions of The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (Westminster) (No. 2) Regulations, 1963 relating to Piccadilly and Regent Street and to re-enact those provisions in a form which takes account of the creation of the bus lanes and the construction of the carriageway referred to in sub-paragraph (c) (1) above:

- (e) to prohibit vehicles turning left from Piccadilly into Albemarle Street;
- (f) to prohibit vehicles in Regent Street (south-east of Piccadilly) from turning right into Piccadilly Circus (south-east of the Shaftesbury Memorial);
- (g) to apply in a modified form the provisions of the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restric-tion) Order 1972 so that:
 - (i) the existing prohibition on waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purposes of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) which applies in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice will apply at any time of the day or night throughout the week;

Braughing R.D.—Bury Green

The southern boundary includes the grounds of Clintons and runs for 900 feet along the lane leading to Thorley Street to include Lower Farm. BEXLEY LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL CLBAN AIR ACT, 1956

The London Borough of Bexley (No. 13) Smoke Control Order, 1973
