It is proposed that the Order shall amend The Rother Valley Light Railway (Extensions) Order 1902 by providing that notwithstanding anything in article 5 of that Order the motive power of the railway shall be steam, diesel, diesel electric, or any combination of these types.

It is proposed that the Order will contain provisions restricting the operation of the railway and providing that certain provisions of The Cranbrook and Tenterden Light Railway Order 1899, The Rother Valley Light Railway (Extensions) Order 1902 and The Kent and East Sussex Light Railway (General Powers) Order 1904 shall not apply

to the Company. It is also proposed that the Order shall apply section 10 (which relates to the erection and maintenance of fences) of the Railway Regulation Act 1842 and section 47 (which relates to the crossing of roads on the level) of the Railways Clauses Consolidation Act 1845 to the railways (or part thereof) hereinbefore described transferred to the Company.

WATER RESOURCES ACT, 1963

NOTICE OF APPLICATION TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Somerset River Authority by Bradfields Farm Ltd., Bradford-on-Tone to vary the combined licence serial number 52/5/401 A and B to abstract water from (a) two boreholes, and (b) a stream feeding a reservoir at NGR—ST—165235 in the parish of Bradford-on-Tone.

The variation applied for is to authorise the increased abstraction of water from the two boreholes from 3,000,000 to 4,000,000 gallons per year for summer spray irrigation of blackcurrant bushes; and from a stream feeding a reservoir at the same location from 705,000 to 1,200,000 gallons per day and from 2,000,000 to 3,000,000 gallons per year for frost protection of 40 acres of blackcurrant bushes.

Total maximum authorised abstraction will therefore become:—two boreholes—10,000,000 gallons per year
