COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL

Borough of Colchester Temporary Restriction of Traffic in Belle Vue Road and Essex Hall Road

Notice is hereby given that because of works which are to be carried out, Essex Hall Road or parts of the road will be temporarily closed to traffic and waiting of vehicles will be restricted or prohibited in the following lengths of road:

- (a) in Essex Hall Road ;
- (b) on the west side of Belle Vue Road for a distance of 95 feet from its junction with Essex Hall Road ;
- (c) on the east side of Belle Vue Road between a point 45 feet from its junction with Colne Bank Avenue and a point 45 feet from its junction with Essex Hall Road between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive.

An Order under section 12 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended, to give effect to the temporary traffic restrictions has been made by the Council, and any person who uses or permits the use of a vehicle in contravention of the Order will be liable on summary conviction to the penalty prescribed by the Act. The Order will continue in force for a period of 6 weeks or until the works which are to be carried out are completed whichever is the earlier. It may, however, be extended with the approval of the Secretary of State for the Environment.

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (Callington) (Various Streets) (Restrictions on Waiting) (Amendment) Order 1973
