

Falmouth, September 26. On the 24th came in the Great-Pearl Privateer of Middleburg, from Cruising to the Southward, Capt. Creade Commander; who, in the Streight's Mouth, engaged and disabled an Algerine Man of War of forty four Guns, by carrying away her Mast, but two other Algerines, one of fifty, and another of forty Guns, came to her Rescue. The same Day arrived the Mercury Packet-boat in ten Days from Lisbon; the Master reports, that he left Admiral Baker with his Fleet in the Latitude of Cape Finister on the 22d Instant: This Day sailed the Mercury Packet-boat, Captain Hooper Commander, for Lisbon, (having about sixty Soldiers belonging to the Earl of Galway's Regiment on Board;) the Squirrel, Capt. Baker Commander, for Newfoundland; the Greyhound Galley for Gibraltar; and the Dolphin Galley to Mounts-Bay, to load Fish for Leghorn.

Portsmouth, September 29. Yesterday Morning Sir John Jennings struck his Flag on Board the St. George, and set out for London. There are at Spithead her Majesty's Ships the St. George, Breda, Charles Galley, Ipswich, Cruiser and Suffolk Hag-boat.

Deale, September 29. Her Majesty's Ship the Rupert, and all the Outward-bound are preparing to sail to the Westward. This Morning came down her Majesty's Ship the Gloucester, and the John and Constant bound for Guiney.
