

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to extinguish the public right of way between Footpath No. 5 and Darlington Street, Wednesbury for a distance of approximately 134 yards near its junction with Darlington Street.

A copy of the Order as confirmed and the Map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Clerk's Office, the Council House, Walsall and at the Town Hall, Darlington during normal office hours.

The Order becomes operative as from 25th May 1973 but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959 as amended or on the ground that any requirement of the Act as amended or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he may, under Paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by Paragraph 7 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 4th May 1973 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.—Dated 1st May 1973.
