HONOURS AND AWARDS

Home Office, Whitehall, London, SW1A 2AP. 18th May 1973.

THE QUEEN has been pleased to award The Queen Police Medal for Gallantry to the late Constable Samuel Richard David Houston of the Royal Ulster Constabulary, in recognition of his gallantry in the following circumstances:

A motorist told Constable Houston, who was on traffic control duty, that he had seen two men emerge from

a parked car, the number plates of which were obscured. The men were carrying a bag which the motorist thought might contain a bomb. Constable Houston immediately ran to the car and ordered the driver out. As he dismounted, the driver began to attack Constable Houston, who had drawn, but did not fire, his revolver. While the constable was struggling with his assailant, the two men whom the motorist had seen earlier, returned to the car and one of them drew a revolver and fired three shots at the constable from very short range. Constable Houston died shortly afterwards. A few minutes later, the bomb exploded a short distance away.

Constable Houston's courage and devotion to duty were

in the highest traditions of the police service.

The Trunk Road (Old Concrete Road, Mold) (Prohibition of Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit waiting on those sides of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.


