

a similar character of stone walls and stone slate roofs, stone paving and a close juxtaposition of dwellings.

The boundary runs north from Lane Head, west along the northern boundary of the library to include the curtilages of properties in Victoria Place and Well Hill, west along the southern side of Scotgate Road and north along the western boundary of O.S. Plot No. 4300 to its north-west apex. The line traverses the valley of the Mag Brook in a northerly direction to the boundary of Spring Wood O.S. Plot No. 0434 which is followed east then north-west to reach the urban district boundary which it follows in an easterly direction until it reaches the River Holme. It then runs south parallel to the river, some 30 feet beyond the eastern bank, to Honley Bridge. The boundary thereafter runs in a general south-westerly direction to include Eastgate, Lower Fold and Upper Fold to reach Southgate where properties north of No. 35 and the Methodist Sunday School are included. It then runs north-west to include the Marsh and thence south-west along the middle of Concord Street to include Old People's Park and some adjoining cottages in Jagger Lane and Moor Bottom to reach Lane Head and thus complete the circuit.

#### *Manor Estate Housing Area Compulsory Purchase Order—1973 No. 1*

Any owner or occupier of any land to which the Order relates may send to Basildon Development Corporation at the address below, a request in writing to serve him with a notice that the Order has been confirmed, and naming the place where a copy of the Order and of the map and of any descriptive matter annexed thereto, may be seen. Such request should contain a statement of the name, postal address and the interest in the land of the owner or occupier, and particulars sufficient to enable the extent and boundaries of the land to be identified.
