Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order was made on the 21st May 1973, and is about to be submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order by the Cirencester Rural District Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to extinguish that length of the public footpath commencing at point "A" on the deposited plan, north of "The Round House" and on the north side of the River Coln, extending in a south-easterly direction for approximately 60 metres thence in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 20 metres across the River Thames to the towpath on the east side of the river at point "B" on the deposited plan being part parcel Nos. 415, 416, 417 and 434 on O.S. Glos. LXI/2 in the Parish of Lechlade in the County of Gloucester.

The Colne Valley Urban District Council (Public Path No. 213-Part) Extinguishment Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 27th March 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Colne Valley Urban District Council. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to extinguish public rights of way in the Deer Hill area of Marsden as follows:

- (1) That part of bridleway 213 (used as footpath) commencing at a point to the east of Deer Hill Conduit and thence proceeding in an easterly direction and terminating in a quarry in the vicinity of Shooter's Nab to the south of the targets of the Deer Hill Rifle Range, for a distance of approximately 520 yards and of a width of approximately four feet (lettered C-D on the map hereafter referred to).
- (2) That part of bridleway 213 (used as footpath) commencing in the West End Quarry area thence proceeding in an easterly direction to a junction with that part of the said bridleway (used as footpath) referred to in (1) above, for a distance of approximately 343 yards and of a width of approximately four feet (lettered F-E on the map hereafter referred to); together with a

branch at approximately its mid-point and proceeding in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 70 yards and of a width of approximately four feet to a point in the vicinity of West End Quarry (lettered J-K on the said map).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Slaithwaite, near Huddersfield, between 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 27th March 1973, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed as an unopposed Order, by the Colne Valley Urban District Council. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert public rights of way in the Deer Hill area of Marsden as follows:

A Description of site of existing path or way

That part of footpath 212 commencing at Deer Hill Conduit Marsden and thence proceeding in a southerly, westerly and southerly direction in the vicinity of Deer Hill Rifle Range to its junction with footpath 213 for a distance of approximately 924 yards and of a width of approximately four feet (lettered A-B on the map hereafter referred to); together with a branch commencing at the said Deer Hill Conduit and thence proceeding in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 100 yards and of a width of approximately four feet to its junction with the main footpath (lettered G-H on the said map).

B Description of site of new path or way

Footpath of width of approximately four feet commencing at the point referred to in A above as the commencement of the main part of the footpath to be diverted and thence proceeding in a southerly and south-westerly direction on the westerly side of the part of footpath 212 to be diverted as referred to in A above for a distance of approximately 870 yards to a junction with footpath 213 (lettered A-B1 on the map hereafter referred to).
