VERDICT

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that, at a Trial of the Pyx begun at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London on the 16th day of March 1973 and concluded on the 11th day of May 1973, the following verdict of the Pyx Jury was delivered to the Queen's Remembrancer, viz.:

The QUEEN has been pleased by Letters Patent under the Great Seal of the Realm, bearing date the 6th day of July 1973, to confer the dignity of a Barony of the United Kingdom for life upon Sir Eric Ashby, Knight, by the name, style and title of BARON ASHBY, of Brandon in the County of Suffolk.

1. We, whose names are hereunder written, were sworn on the 16th day of March 1973 before the Queen's Remembrancer at Goldsmiths' Hall in the City of London to make assays and trials of Her Majesty's coins which, according to accounts produced by the officers of the Royal Mint were coined in the said Mint from the 1st day of January 1972 to the 31st day of December 1972, both days inclusive, in accordance with the Coinage Act 1971 or the Proclamation dated the 23rd day of October 1972 for determining the specifications and design for the twenty-five
