Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Blewbury, in the County of Berkshire, ten days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forthwith and entirely in

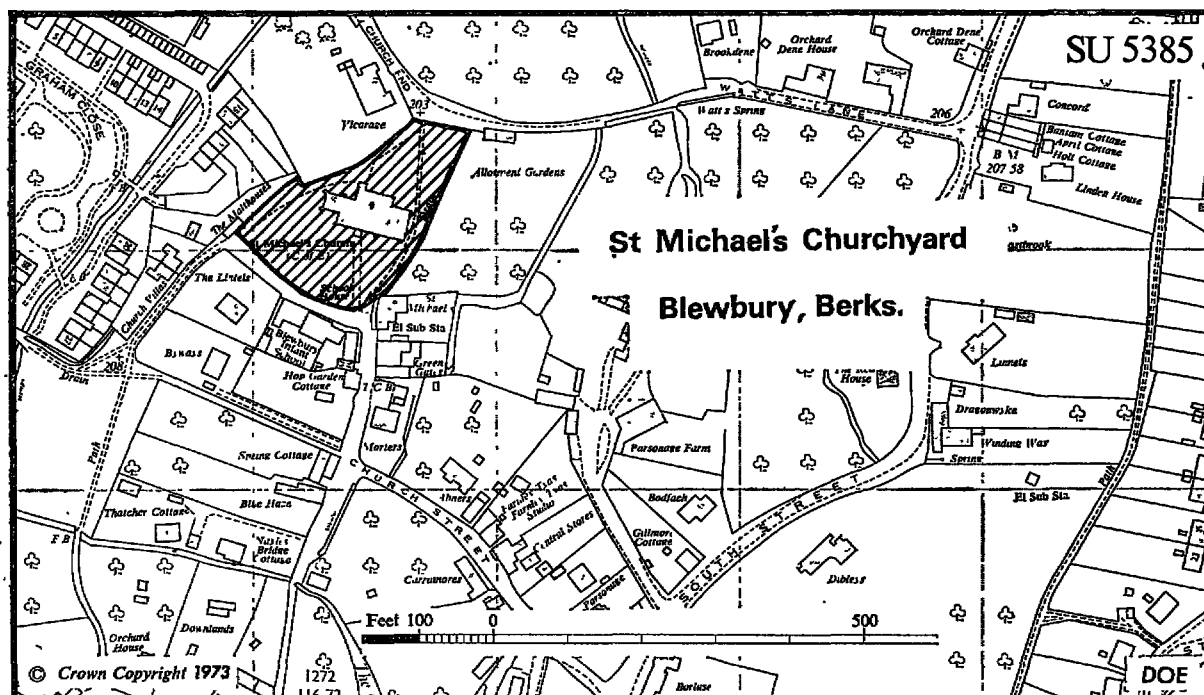
St. Michael's Churchyard in the said Parish, as shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 20th day of September next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the *London Gazette*, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 20th day of September.

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The County Council of Glamorgan (Route A473 Bridgend to Laleston Classified Road) (Side Roads) Order 1973

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has confirmed the above-named Order which was

made by the County Council of Glamorgan under section 1 of the Highways Act 1971 and which, as confirmed, provides for authorising the Council

- To stop up a length of unclassified road at Laleston in the County of Glamorgan which extends from its junction with High Street in a northerly direction for 3.5 metres; and
- To construct a new road to run in a northerly direction from the line of the proposed carriageway edge of High Street, Laleston, for 35 metres, with a link road 10 metres in length running off the new road in a westerly direction.

Copies of the Order (as confirmed) and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Glamorgan County Council and at the Welsh Office, Roads Division, Graham Buildings, Newport Road, Cardiff.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 26th July 1973 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
