At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 27th day of July 1973

PRESENT,

THE QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865(a) it is enacted that all pay, wages, pensions, bounty money, grants or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Her Majesty's naval or marine force to a person being or having been an officer, seaman or marine, or to the widow or any relative of a deceased officer, seaman or marine, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions, as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

And whereas Her Majesty deems it expedient to amend the Order in Council dated 25th September 1964, as amended (b), concerning pensions and other grants in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939 (hereinafter referred to as "the 1964 Order "):

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her as aforesaid and of all other powers whatsoever Her thereunto enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered that, notwithstanding anything in the 1964 Order, the following provisions of this Order shall take effect accordingly and, except in the cases stated in the Order in Council of 19th December 1881, and except as otherwise provided by statute, shall be established and obeyed as the sole authority in the matters herein treated of.

Substitution of Schedules to the 1964 Order

1. For Schedules 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order (rates of pensions and other grants payable in respect of disablement or death due to service in the naval forces during the 1914 World War and after 2nd September 1939) there shall be substituted the Schedules set out in Part I of the Appendix hereto and numbered 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 respectively.

Amendment of Articles of the 1964 Order

2.—(1) In Articles 15 (severe disablement occupational allowance), 17 (unemployability allowances), 19 (allowance for lowered standard of occupation), 21 (treatment allowances) and 25 (application of Part IV) of the 1964 Order there shall be made the amendments set out in Part II of the Appendix hereto.

(2) Notwithstanding the foregoing provisions of this Article, sub-paragraph (a) of paragraph (4) of the said Article 17 shall continue to apply to an award made thereunder before 1st October 1973 as it would have applied had this Order not issued in all cases where the rate of allowance payable under such award was not, having regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance had been granted, further increased under sub-paragraph (c) of the said paragraph (4):

(b) The relevant amending Orders are the Orders of 22nd December 1964, 24th February 1966, 9th June 1966, 23rd August 1967, 26th July 1968, 31st July 1969, 28th July 1971 and 26th July 1972.

Provided that if, in any case, the rate of allowance in respect of a wife, husband or unmarried dependant living as a wife should be increased, after the coming into operation of this Order, under paragraph (4)(b) of Article 17 of the 1964 Order, as substituted by the foregoing provisions of this Article, the provisions of this paragraph shall cease to apply to that case.

Revocation of the provisions of the 1920, 1921 and 1964 Orders in Council relating to killed in action gratuities and to certain widows

3.—(1) Article 28 of and Schedule 5 to the 1964 Order (widow's gratuities) and Article 11(4), Article 12(3) and Article 17(3) of the 1921 (Officers) Order and Article 11(2), Article 12(2) and Article 17(3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order (widow's and children's gratuities) are hereby revoked, so, however, that the said Article 28 and column (2) of the said Schedule 5 shall continue to apply to any deaths occurring before 1st August 1973 as they would have applied but for their revocation.

(2) Article 24(2) of the 1920 Order, Article 30(2) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or Article 23(2) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and Article 27(3) of the 1964 Order (definition of 1914-18 War widows) are hereby revoked, so, however, that no pension or award shall be payable as a result of any such revocation for any period prior to 1st October 1973.

Interpretation and commencement

4.—(1) This Order shall be construed as one with the 1964 Order and, subject to the following provisions of this Article, shall come into operation on 1st October 1973, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to 1st October 1973, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following 1st October 1973.

(2) In so far as Article 1 substitutes the higher maximum rate of allowance for part-time treatment specified in paragraph 10 of Schedule 6 in Part 1 of the Appendix hereto, it shall be deemed to have come into operation on 25th June 1973.

(3) Article 2, in so far as it amends Article 19 of the 1964 Order, and Article 3(1) shall come into operation on 1st August 1973.

Amendment of Articles of the 1964 Order 1. In Article 15 (severe disablement occupational allowance) the words " or would be in receipt of such an allowance if he were not in a hospital or other institution," shall be omitted, and there shall be added to the Article the words " other than injury benefit or sickness benefit.". 2. For paragraph (4) of Article 17 (unemployability allowances) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:----" (4) Where a member is awarded an allowance under paragraph (1)(i) of this Article, he may also be awarded additional allowances for dependants in accordance with the following provisions of this paragraph---

- (a) in the case of a woman member of the naval forces an allowance may be awarded in respect of a husband to whom she was married after the material date, at the rate and subject to the conditions which would be appropriate under Article 12 if the husband were an eligible member of the family, and any such allowance shall be treated as an allowance under (a) of the Table in Article 12(2) for the purpose of determining the rate of any allowance for a child under Article 12 or under sub-paragraph (d) of this paragraph;
- (b) where an allowance has been awarded under Article 12 in respect of a wife, husband or unmarried dependant living as a wife, or where an allowance has been awarded under sub-paragreph (a) of this paragraph, the rate of the allowance may be increased by an amount not exceeding the appropriate amount in Schedule 6 paragraph 5 (b)(i), if the Secretary of State thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance has been granted;
- (c) where the member is not in receipt of an allowance under Article 12 or under sub-paragraph (a) of this para-graph in respect of a wife or husband (whether married to the member before or after the material date) or unmarried dependant living as a wife, an allowance may be awarded in respect of an adult dependant at a rate not exceeding the appropriate rate specified in Schedule 6 paragraph 5(b)(ii) if the Secretary of State thinks fit having regard to the financial circumstances of the person in respect of whom the allowance is claimed: Provided that an allowance shall not be awarded in respect of more than one adult dependant;
- (d) an allowance may be awarded to a member in respect of any child, not being an eligible member of the family, who should, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, be treated as such having regard to the child's relation-ship to or connection with the member and the other circumstances of the case: Provided that any such allowance shall be at the rate and subject to the conditions which would be appropriate under Article 12 if the child were an eligible member of the family;
- (e) where an allowance has been awarded under Article 12 or sub-paragraph (d) of this paragraph in respect of the child or children of a member, the rate thereof in respect of that child or those children may be increased by the appropriate rate or rates specified in Schedule 6 paragraph 5(b)(iii).".
- 3. For paragraph (2) of Article 19 (allowance for lowered standard of occupation) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:-
 - (2) In this Article " regular occupation " means-
 - (a) where the member's disablement is due to service between 2nd September 1939 and 1st August 1973, the occupation which was his regular occupation before his service;
 - (b) where the member's disablement is due to service after 31st July 1973, the occupation which was his regular occupation on the date when he sustained the wound or injury, or was first removed from duty on account of the disease, on which his award is based, or if there were no such occurrences, the date of the termination of his service;
 - (c) where the member's disablement is due to service during the 1914 World War, the occupation which was the most remunerative occupation which, in the opinion of the Secretary of State, accounted for a substantial period of his employment during the period beginning with 1st July 1944 and ending with 1st July 1945.".
 - 4. In Article 21 (treatment allowances)-

 - - - - (d) is in receipt of an increase of this personal of such an increase; or (b) is in receipt of an allowance under Article 17(1)(i); or

 - (c) having reached the age of 65 years or, in the case of a woman member, 60 years, is not eligible for retirement pension under the National Insurance Acts 1965 to 1973, or any benefit similar thereto as is referred to in paragraph (6) of this Article."

(d) For paragraph (8) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:---(a) In this Article "treatment " means---(a) any treatment as an in-patient of a hospital or similar institution; or
(b) a course of medical, surgical or rehabilitative treatment of a remedial nature;
which in either case the Secretary of State is satisfied that a member of the naval forces should receive in consequence of any disablement in respect of which an award under this Order or any previous Order may be or has been made but does not include any treatment which involves no or only occasional interruptions of the member's normal employment.".

 For paragraph (3) of Article 25 (application of Part IV) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—
 "(3) The death of a member occurring after 22nd November 1916 at a time when an allowance in respect of (s) The dealt of a method of contains a rate not less than three-quarters of the normal maximum rate for the time being in force (hereinafter referred to as "the qualifying rate") in respect of a period ending with his death, or would have been so payable if he had not been in a hospital or other institution, shall be regarded as due to service for the purposes of the following provisions of this Part so, however, that no award shall be made thereunder in respect of any period before 1st October 1973 where the qualifying rate is less than the normal maximum rate, or 20th September 1071 is or would have been a service for the service for the purposes of the following provisions of the service for the purpose of the normal maximum rate, or 20th September 1971 in any other case.".

EXPLANATORY NOTE

(This Note is not part of the Order)

This Order in Council further amends the Orders in Council of 11th June 1920, 9th March 1921 and 25th September 1964. Article 1 substitutes new Tables for those contained in Schedules 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7 to the 1964 Order and has the effect of increasing-

Disablement pensions and allowances

- (c) the normal maximum rate of an allowance payable for constant attendance from £234.00 a year to £267.80 a year in the case of officers and from £4.50 a week to £5.15 a week in the case of ratings and the maximum rate for exceptional cases of very severe disablement from £468.00 a year to £535.60 a year in the case of officers and from £9.00 a week to £10.30 a week in the case of ratings;
- (d) the exceptionally severe disablement allowance from £234.00 a year to £267.80 a year in the case of officers and from £4.50 a week to £5.15 a week in the case of ratings;
- (e) the severe disablement occupational allowance from £104.00 a year to £135.20 a year in the case of officers and from £2.00 a week to £2.60 a week in the case of ratings;
- (f) the allowances for wear and tear of clothing from £12.00 a year and £19.00 a year to £14.00 a year and £22.00 a year respectively;
- (g) the allowance for unemployable pensioners from £382.20 a year to £436.80 a year in the case of officers and from £7.35 a week to £8.40 a week in the case of ratings;
- (h) the additional allowance payable in respect of the wife of an unemployable pensioner from £179.80 a year to £247.00 a year in the case of officers and from £3.65 a week to £4.75 a week in the case of ratings and for an adult dependent from £215.80 a year to £247.00 a year in the case of officers and from £4.15 a week to £4.75 a week in the case of ratings;
- (i) the allowances payable in respect of children of unemployable pensioners in respect of the first or only child from £171.60 a year to £197.60 a year in the case of officers and from £3.30 a week to £3.80 a week in the case of ratings, in respect of the second child from £124.80 a year to £150.80 a year in the case of officers and from £2.40 a week to £2.90 a week in the case of ratings and in respect of any other child from £119.60 a year to £145.60 a year in the case of officers and from £2.30 a week to £2.80 a week in the case of ratings;
- (j) the invalidity allowance payable with unemployability allowance from £59.80 a year, £36.40 a year and £18.20 a year to £83.20 a year, £52.00 a year and £26.00 a year respectively in the case of officers and from £1.15 a week, £0.70 a week and £0.35 a week to £1.60 a week, £1.00 a week and £0.50 a week respectively in the case of ratings;
- (k) the allowances for comforts from £88.40 a year and £44.20 a year to £114.40 a year and £57.20 a year in the case of officers and from £1.70 a week and £0.85 a week to £2.20 a week and £1.10 a week in the case of ratings;
- (1) the maximum allowance for lowered standard of occupation from £232.96 a year to 266.24 a year in the case of officers and from £4.48 a week to £5.12 a week in the case of ratings;
- (m) the allowances payable to pensioners who have attained the age of 65 and whose pensioned disablement is assessed at 40 per cent. or over from between £28.60 a year and £83.20 a year to between £31.20 a year and £93.60 a year in the case of officers and from between £0.55 a week and £1.60 a week to between £0.60 a week and £1.80 a week in the case of ratings;
- (n) the allowance payable in respect of the wife or adult dependant of a pensioner receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) from £215.80 a year to £236.60 a year in the case of officers and from £4.15 a week to £4.55 a week in the case of ratings and to increase further that allowance where the said pensioner has reached 65 years (60 if a woman) or is not entitled to invalidity pension and allowance under national insurance provisions solely because of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions, to £247.00 a year and £4.75 a week respectively;
- (a) the allowances payable in respect of children of a pensioner receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) in respect of the first or only child from £109.20 a year to £119.60 a year in the case of officers and from £2.10 a week to £2.30 a week in the case of ratings, in respect of the second child from £62.40 a year to £72.80 a year in the case of officers and from £1.20 a week to £1.40 a week in the case of ratings and in respect of any other child from £57.20 a year to £67.60 a year in the case of officers and from £1.10 a week to £1.30 a week in the case of ratings and to increase further those allowances where the said pensioner has reached 65 years (60 if a woman) or is not entitled to invalidity pension and allowance under national insurance provisions solely because of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions, to £197.60 a year; £3.80 a week; £150.80 a year; £2.90 a week; £145.60 a year and £2.80 a week respectively;
- (p) the maximum of the additional personal treatment allowance payable under Article 21(3)(a) to a pensioner who is not entitled to full sickness benefit under national insurance provisions from £6.75 a week to £7.35 a week and to a pensioner who has reached 65 years (60 if a woman) or who is not entitled to invalidity pension and allowance solely because of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions, from £6.75 a week to £7.75 a week;
- (q) the rates of the additional personal treatment allowance payable under Article 21(3)(c) to a pensioner who is not entitled to invalidity pension and allowance solely because of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions, from £59.80 a year to £83.20 a year in the case of officers and from £1.15 a week to £1.60 a week in the case of ratings, from £36.40 a year to £52.00 a year in the case of officers and from £0.70 a week to £1.00 a week in the case of ratings and from £18.20 a year to £26.00 a year in the case of officers and from £0.35 a week to £0.50 a week in the case of ratings, depending in all cases upon the qualifying date;
- (7) the maximum rate of allowance payable to certain persons having regard to any remunerative time lost as a result of receiving part-time treatment for their pensioned disablement from £4.75 a day to £5.50 a day;

Widows' benefits

- (s) the rates of pensions for certain widows by $\pounds 68.00$ a year in the case of officers and by $\pounds 1.30$ a week in the case of ratings;
- (t) the maximum pensions payable to unmarried dependants who lived as wives of deceased members of the naval forces from £458.50 a year to £526.00 a year in the case of officers and from £8.30 a week to £9.60 a week in the case of ratings;
- (u) the allowance payable between age 65 and 70 to elderly widows and unmarried dependants who have lived as wives from £26.00 a year to £33.80 a year in the case of officers and from £0.50 a week to £0.65 a week in the case of ratings and to those age 70 or over from £52.00 a year to £67.60 a year in the case of officers and from £1.00 a week to £1.30 a week in the case of ratings;
- (v) the maximum rent allowance payable to certain widows from $\pounds 3 \cdot 40$ a week to $\pounds 3 \cdot 90$ a week;
- (w) the allowances payable to widows in respect of children for the first or only child from £190.10 a year to £216.10 a year in the case of officers and from £3.50 a week to £4.00 a week in the case of ratings and in respect of each other child from £164.10 a year to £190.10 a year in the case of officers and from £3.00 a week to £3.50 a week in the case of ratings where the child qualifies for a family allowance, and from £182.30 a year to £208.30 a year in the case of officers and from £3.35 a week to £3.85 a week in the case of ratings where the child does not so qualify;

Other benefits

- (x) the maximum pensions payable to certain widowers from £464.00 a year to £532.00 a year in the case of officers and from £8.80 a week to £10.10 a week in the case of ratings;
- (y) the rates of pensions and allowances payable to or in respect of the children of deceased members of the naval forces (such children having become motherless or having ceased to be under the control of thier mothers) in respect of the first or only child or any other child who does not qualify for a family allowance from £269.30 a year to £295.30 a year in the case of children of officers and from £3.50 or £5.00 a week to £4.00 or £5.50 a week (according to the age of the child) in the case of children of ratings and in respect of each other child who qualifies for a family allowance from £243.30 a year to £269.30 a year in the case of children of officers and from £3.00 or £4.50 a week to £3.50 or £5.00 a week (according to the age of the child)in the case of children of ratings;

- (s) the maximum rates of pensions payable to motherless or fatherless children who, having attained the age of 18 years, are incapable of self-support by reason of infirmity which arose before they attained the normal age limit for pension purposes, from £351.00 a year to £403.00 a year in the case of children of officers and from £6.75 a week to £7.75 a week in the case of children of ratings; Articles 2 and 3 make amendments to the 1920, 1921 and 1964 Orders which— (a) enable a severe disablement occupational allowance awarded under Article 15 to continue in payment during any period
- notwithstanding that a member becomes in receipt of injury benefit or sickness benefit during such period; (b) enable the increased allowances payable in respect of the wife, husband, unmarried dependant living as a wife, or child
- of an unemployable pensioner to be awarded in addition to, rather than in lieu of, the basic allowances payable in respect of such dependants with disablement pension;
- (c) enable entitlement to an allowance for lowered standard of occupation to be determined in relation to future service by reference to the member's regular occupation in service instead of, as hitherto, his regular occupation before service, if anv:
- (d) clarify the grounds upon which a treatment allowance may be awarded;
 (e) enable the increased additional allowances payable in respect of the wife, husband, unmarried dependant living as a wife, or child of a pensioner receiving treatment as defined in Article 21(8) to be awarded in addition to, rather than in lieu of,
- (f) increase further the allowances in respect of such dependants;
 (f) increase further the allowances in respect of the wife or adult dependant of a pensioner receiving treatment as aforesaid where such pensioner is not entitled to invalidity pension and allowance under national insurance provisions solely by reason of failure to satisfy the contribution conditions, or where the pensioner has attained 65 years of age (60 if a woman) and is not entitled to a retirement pension under the last mentioned provisions;
- (g) extend the provisions relating to a child or children of a pensioner receiving treatment as aforesaid so that the conditions for a further increase of allowance in respect of such child or children correspond to those for an adult dependant outlined above:
