Provided that if, in any case, the rate of allowance in respect of a wife, husband or unmarried dependant living as a wife should be increased, after the coming into operation of this Order, under paragraph (4)(b) of Article 17 of the 1964 Order, as substituted by the foregoing provisions of this Article, the provisions of this paragraph shall cease to apply to that case.

Revocation of the provisions of the 1920, 1921 and 1964 Orders in Council relating to killed in action gratuities and to certain widows

3.—(1) Article 28 of and Schedule 5 to the 1964 Order (widow's gratuities) and Article 11(4), Article 12(3) and Article 17(3) of the 1921 (Officers) Order and Article 11(2), Article 12(2) and Article 17(3) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order (widow's and children's gratuities) are hereby revoked, so, however, that the said Article 28 and column (2) of the said Schedule 5 shall continue to apply to any deaths occurring before 1st August 1973 as they would have applied but for their revocation.

(2) Article 24(2) of the 1920 Order, Article 30(2) of the 1921 (Officers) Order or Article 23(2) of the 1921 (Warrant Officers) Order and Article 27(3) of the 1964 Order (definition of 1914-18 War widows) are hereby revoked, so, however, that no pension or award shall be payable as a result of any such revocation for any period prior to 1st October 1973.

## Interpretation and commencement

4.—(1) This Order shall be construed as one with the 1964 Order and, subject to the following provisions of this Article, shall come into operation on 1st October 1973, so, however, that in relation to any award payable weekly the foregoing reference to 1st October 1973, where this is not the normal weekly pay day for that award, shall be construed as a reference to the first normal weekly pay day for that award following 1st October 1973.

(2) In so far as Article 1 substitutes the higher maximum rate of allowance for part-time treatment specified in paragraph 10 of Schedule 6 in Part 1 of the Appendix hereto, it shall be deemed to have come into operation on 25th June 1973.

(3) Article 2, in so far as it amends Article 19 of the 1964 Order, and Article 3(1) shall come into operation on 1st August 1973. W. G. Agnew
