Conservation Area at Lymptone in the St. Thomas Rural District

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council have designated a Conservation Area at Lymptone in accordance with the provisions of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

The Conservation Area is described as follows:

Lymptone Conservation Area is linear in shape including all properties and their curtilages on the main access road through the village, i.e. The Strand and Church Road as far east as Stone Lane with the exception of the Retreat and Woodstock in Church Road. To the east, Romany Cottage on Strawberry Hill is included while the Conservation Area extends southwards beyond Watton Brook to include The Mill. All properties facing onto the foreshore are included, as are properties facing onto the south side of Underhill as far east as Metherells, and a group of houses immediately north-west of Metherells bordering on O.S. Plot 8997. The Conservation Area extends along Sowden Lane as far south as Highcliffe Bungalow and also includes the primary school buildings on School Hill.

The area is considered by the County Council to be of special interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve and enhance and future development in this area will be subject to strict planning controls designed to secure the preservation of the character and general improvement of the area.

Conservation Area at Kenton in the St. Thomas Rural District

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council have designated a Conservation Area at Kenton in accordance with the provisions of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The Conservation Area is described as follows:

Kenton Conservation Area includes most of the village centre grouped around the parish church of All Saints. All buildings and their curtilages in Church Street and High Street are included with the exception of Elmhurst, Fieldings and an unnamed bungalow at the north-western end of High Street. The Conservation Area extends southwards along Mamhead Road, as far as Ford Farm on its western side and Brookside Cottage on its eastern side, while

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the northern boundary is formed by Kings Hill and the A.379 road to Exeter. Buildings on both sides of Fore Street are included from Triangle Cottage and the Dolphin Inn as far east as the "Cottage" on its northern side and the offices of John Baker (Kenton Forge) Ltd. on its southern side.

The area is considered by the County Council to be of special interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve and enhance and future development in this area will be subject to strict planning control designed to secure the preservation of the character and general improvement of the area.

Gloucestershire County Council (KW62 Kingswood) Public Path Diversion Order, 1973
