#### THE LORD-LIEUTENANTS ORDER 1973

Made - - 24th October 1973 Coming into Operation 1st November 1973

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 24th day of October 1973

Present,

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Her Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section 218(4) of the Local Government Act 1972 (1972 c. 70), is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. This Order may be cited as the Lord-Lieutenants Order 1973 and shall come into operation on 1st November 1973.

2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889 c. 63), shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

3. Any lieutenant described in column (1) of the Schedule to this Order shall continue to hold office on and after 1st April 1974 as specified in relation to him in column (2) of the said Schedule. W. G. Agnew
