Notice is hereby given that on the 25th October 1973 the Derbyshire County Council made an Order, under sections 1 and 84 (D) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968. On the west side from a point 90 yards north of its junc-tion with Station Street in a northerly direction to a point 50 yards south of the southern end of Compton Bridge.

NOTE. The (Buxton Road, Compton Street and Park Road, Ashbourne) (Prohibition and Restric-tion of Waiting) Order 1971 so far as it relates to Compton Street in Schedule 1, and the (Various Streets, Ashbourne Urban District) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1973 so far as it relates to Compton Street in Schedules 2 and 3 are hereby revoked from the effective date of the Order. of the Order.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable a vehicle loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building opera-tion or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein to take in potential cit mater are significant. traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situate within the lengths of road; or as part of a funeral cortege. The County of Devon (Various Streets, Newton Abbot) (One-Way and Restrictions on Waiting, Loading and Unloading) Order, 1973.

Notice is hereby given that the Devon County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1 (1), (2) and (3) and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, varying and extending traffic restrictions at Newton Abbot.

When the proposed Order comes into effect: (1) You will not be allowed to leave your vehicle:

- (a) at any time in specified lengths of Bank Street, Courtenay Street, Cricketfield Road, East Street, Halcyon Road, Hampton Road, Highweek Street, Hilton Road, Kingsteignton Road, Market Street, Marsh Road, Prospect Terrace, Queen Street, Station Road, Western Road, and Wolborough Street :
- 33A Torquay Road, St. John's Street ;
- (c) for a longer period than 1 hour (no return within 1 hour) between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in specified lengths of Courtenay Street, Fairfield Terrace, Halcyon Road, Marsh Road, Prospect Terrace, Queen Street, Union Street and Wolborough Street:
- (2) You will not be allowed to load or unload your vehicle between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4 p.m. and 6 p.m., Monday to Saturday, in specified lengths of Bank Street, Courtenay Street, East Street, Highweek Street, and Queen Street:
- (3) You will not be allowed to drive your vehicle in the following road except in the direction stated:

Road and Direction

Fairfield Terrace, from north to south (i.e. from Queen Street towards Torquay Road).

Except as mentioned in (2) above, there will be exceptions in the Order to permit waiting for the purpose of:

(a) picking up and setting down passengers ;

(b) loading or unloading goods;

(c) collecting or delivering postal packets for the Post Office ;

(d) taking in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage;

and, where necessary, in connection with-

(e) the maintenance of the road; and

(f) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

The restriction in (1) (c) above will not apply to vehicles displaying an authorised disabled person's badge issued by a local authority.
