WEST RIDING OF YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire (Montagu Street and Gordon Street, Goole) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1974

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of the West Riding of Yorkshire propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968.

Public Path Diversion Order No. 18, 1973*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 30th day of November 1973 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Huntingdon and Peterborough County Council as an unopposed Order.
