### DRAFT SPECIAL REGULATIONS Factories Act 1961

In pursuance of section 180 of and Schedule 4 to the Factories Act 1961, the Secretary of State for Employment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make under section 76 of the Act special regulations making provision for the protection of the eyes of persons employed in factories and certain other premises and places to which the Factories Act 1961 applies, while any of the processes specified in Schedule 1 to the Regulations is being carried on. will require the provision of eye protectors or of shields (either worn by the person, held in the hand or independently mounted) for the protection of persons employed in (and in one case, at risk from) such processes. Eye

protectors and, with certain exceptions, shields will be required to conform with specifications approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories. Independently mounted shields will be required to be provided for other persons employed in positions where their eyes are at risk of injury from particles or fragments thrown off or radiation produced in the continuous of section provided to the continuous of the duced in the carrying on of certain specified processes.

The Regulations will supersede the Protection of Eyes

Regulations 1938, and certain provisions requiring the provision of goggles or other means of protection contained in the Chemical Works Regulations 1922, the Iron and Steel Foundries Regulations 1953, the Shipbuilding and Ship-repairing Regulations 1960, the Construction (General Pro-visions) Regulations 1961 and the Non-Ferrous Metals (Melting and Founding) Regulations 1962.

Copies of the draft regulations which are entitled The Protection of Eyes Regulations 1973 (and are in substitution for the statutory draft of the Regulations similarly entitled published in July 1972 which the Secretary of State has withdrawn) may be obtained from H.M. Stationery Office, at the addresses shown on the last page of the Gazette or through any bookseller.

Any objection to the draft regulations by or on behalf of persons affected must be sent on or before 15th March 1974.

Every objection must be in writing and state:

(a) the specific grounds of objection; and

(b) the omissions, additions or modifications asked for.

The London-Fishguard Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order, 1973 Made 14th November 1973

Coming into Operation 11th February 1974

The Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of the powers conferred by sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and (6) and 85D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 (c.76), as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 (c. 73) and now vested in him (S.I. 1970/1681 (1970 III, p. 5551)), and of all other enabling powers hereby makes the following Order:

#### Commencement and Citation

1. This Order shall come into operation on 11th February 1974 and may be cited as the London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order 1973.

2.—(1) In this Order the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:

"the Act of 1967" means the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968;

"the trunk road" means the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.40);

"the main carriageway", in relation to the trunk road, means any carriageway of that road used primarily by through traffic, includes any carriageway of a slip road, but excludes any lay-by; "lay-by", in relation to a main carriageway of the trunk

road, means an area intended for use for the waiting of vehicles, lying at a side of the road and bounded or venicies, lying at a side of the road and bounded partly by a traffic sign of the type shown in diagram 1010 of the Traffic Signs Regulations 1964 (S.I. 1964/1857 (1964 III, p.4053)), as amended by Regulation 2(14) of the Schedule 2 to the Traffic Signs (Amendment) Regulations 1966 (S.I. 1966/490 (1966 I, p. 1001), and partly by the outer edge of that carriageway of the start on which the sign the same side of the road as that on which the sign is placed; "verge" means any part of a road which is not a

carriageway.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 (c. 63) shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the inter-pretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 38 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by Article 8 of this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.

## Prohibition of waiting on main carriageways

3. Save as provided in Article 4 of this Order no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform or of a traffic warden cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any of those main carriage-ways forming part of the length of the trunk road specified in the Schedule to this Order.

#### Exceptions to Article 3

4. Noting in Article 3 of this Order shall apply:

(a) so as to prevent a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway specified in the Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable a vehicle, if it cannot be used for such purpose without waiting on that carriageway, to be used in connection with any building operation of development of the such purpose. any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction or potential obstruction to traffic, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road comprising that carriageway, or the erection, laying, placing maintenance, testing, alteration, repair or removal of any structure, works or apparatus in, on, under or over that road;

(b) to a vehicle being used for fire brigade, ambulance or

police purposes;

(c) to a vehicle being used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets as defined in section 87 of the Post Office Act 1953 (c.36);

(d) so as to prevent a vehicle being used by or on behalf of a local authority from waiting on any main carriageway specified in the Schedule to this Order for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot be used for such a purpose without waiting on that carriageway, to be used for the purpose of the collection of household refuse from, or the clearing of cesspools at, premises situated on or adjacent to the road comprising that carriageway;

(e) to a vehicle waiting on any main carriageway specified in the Schedule to this Order while any gate or other barrier at the entrance to premises to which the vehicle requires access or from which it has emerged is opened or closed, if it is not reasonably practicable for the vehicle to wait otherwise than on that carriageway while such gate or barrier is being opened or closed;

- (f) to a vehicle waiting in any case where the person in control of the vehicle:

(i) is required by law to stop;(ii) is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident;

Or

(iii) is prevented from proceeding by circumstances outside his control and it is not reasonbly practicable for him to drive or move the vehicle to a place not on any main carriageway specified in the Schedule to this Order.

Restrictions of waiting on verges, etc.

5. No person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait on any verge or lay-by immediately adjacent to a main carriageway specified in the Schedule to this Order for the purpose of selling goods from that vehicle unless the goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which sale is effected.

#### Non-application of section 1 (5) of Act of 1967

6. The Secretary of State is satisfied that, for avoiding danger to persons or other traffic using the road to which this Order relates, it is requisite that section 1 (5) of the Act of 1967 should not apply in relation to this Order.

7. The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order 1964 (S.I. 1964/677) is hereby varied and shall have effect as though in the Schedule thereto item 3 (which relates to the main carriageways comprised in a specified length of the trunk road) were omitted.

#### Revocation

8. The London—Fishguard Trunk Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order 1965 (S.I. 1965/2200) and the London—Fishguard Road (Prohibition of Waiting) (Clearways) Order 1966 (S.I. 1966/1109) are hereby revoked.
