DRAFT SPECIAL REGULATIONS

Factories Act 1961

In pursuance of section 180 of and Schedule 4 to the Factories Act 1961, the Secretary of State for Employment hereby gives notice that he proposes to make under section 76 of the Act special regulations making provision for the protection of the eyes of persons employed in factories and certain other premises and places to which the Factories Act 1961 applies, while any of the processes specified in Schedule 1 to the Regulations is being carried on. They will require the provision of eye protectors or of shields (either worn by the person, held in the hand or independently mounted) for the protection of persons employed in (and in one case, at risk from) such processes.
