protectors and, with certain exceptions, shields will be required to conform with specifications approved by the Chief Inspector of Factories. Independently mounted shields will be required to be provided for other persons employed in positions where their eyes are at risk of injury from particles or fragments thrown off or radiation produced in the carrying on of certain specified processes.

The Regulations will supersede the Protection of Eyes

Regulations 1938, and certain provisions requiring the provision of goggles or other means of protection contained in the Chemical Works Regulations 1922, the Iron and Steel Foundries Regulations 1953, the Shipbuilding and Ship-repairing Regulations 1960, the Construction (General Pro-visions) Regulations 1961 and the Non-Ferrous Metals (Melting and Founding) Regulations 1962.

Copies of the draft regulations which are entitled The Protection of Eyes Regulations 1973 (and are in substitution for the statutory draft of the Regulations similarly entitled published in July 1972 which the Secretary of State has withdrawn) may be obtained from H.M.
