CLEAN AIR ACTS 1956 AND 1968

The City of Leeds No. 118 Castleton (Armley Road) Smoke Control Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Leeds acting by the Council for the said City in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Clean Air Acts, 1956 (Section 11) and 1968 on the 18th January 1974 made the above-mentioned Order declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a Smoke Control Area which Order has been submitted to the Department of the Environment for confirmation. Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of Section 11 (4) of the principal Act, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from the chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20.00 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than the authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity. In addition, in accordance with the Clean Air Act, 1968 Section 9 (1) any person who acquires or sells any solid fuel, other than an authorised fuel for use in a building in the Smoke Control Area shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20.00. If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1974 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Environment. Copies of the Order and Plan referred to therein may be inspected, free of charge, at the Information Centre, Civic Hall, Leeds 1, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 8th February 1974. Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order, may, by notice in writing to The Secretary, Department of the Environment, Marsham Street, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

All those lands in the City of Leeds bounded to the north by the southern boundaries of the City of Leeds No. 15 Poplar and No. 46 Armley (Armley Grange) Smoke Control Areas, Armley Ridge Road (part), Stanningley Road (part), Hope View, the eastern boundary of the City of Leeds No. 71 Bramley (Wyther) Smoke Control Area, land owned by British Transport Commission, to the east by Oak Road, Green Lane, Tong Road (part), the western boundary of the City of Leeds No. 69 Wellington (Wellington Road) Smoke Control Area, to the south by land owned by British Transport Commission, Tong Road (part), to the west by Albany Terrace, Whingate Road (part), Congress Mount, land owned by British Transport Commission, and more particularly delineated on the map hereinbefore referred to.

CLEAN AIR ACT, 1956

The Waltham Forest (Nos. 21 & 22) Smoke Control Orders, 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the London Borough of Waltham Forest, acting by the Council, in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 24th day of January 1974, made Orders entitled the Waltham Forest (No. 21) Smoke Control Order, 1974, and the Waltham Forest (No. 22) Smoke Control Order, 1974, declaring the areas described in the Schedule hereto to be smoke control areas, which Orders have been submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Orders and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Orders have come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control areas the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The

authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

Copies of the Orders and the maps referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Forest Road, Walthamstow, London E.17, at all reasonable times during the period of 6 weeks from the 8th February 1974.

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Orders may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London, SW1P 3EB, object to the confirmation of the Orders.

SCHEDULE

The Waltham Forest (No. 21) Smoke Control Order, 1974

Commencing at the junction of the Railway Bridge and Whitehall Road proceed east along the centre of Whitehall Road to the borough boundary then south following the line of the borough boundary to Chingford Lane. Then south and west along the old borough boundary between Chingford and Walthamstow to the Eastern Region railway line, then north along the railway line to Whitehall Road.

The Waltham Forest (No. 22) Smoke Control Order, 1974

Commencing at the junction of Bury Road with the borough boundary proceed east and south following the borough boundary to the junction with Whitehall Road. Then west along the centre of Whitehall Road and Kings Road to the junction with Station Road then north along the centre of Station Road and Bury Road to the borough boundary.

THE CLEAN AIR ACTS, 1956 AND 1968

The Wath Upon Dearne (No. 9) Smoke Control Order, 1973

Notice is hereby given that the Wath upon Dearne Urban District Council in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956 on the 19th December 1973 made an Order entitled the Wath upon Dearne (No. 9) Smoke Control Order, 1973 declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Clean Air Act, 1956, if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the Smoke Control Area, the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £20, unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel, and subject to the above mentioned exemption, any person who acquires any solid fuel, other than an authorised fuel, for use in a building, boiler or industrial plant in the smoke control area, or sells by retail for delivery by him or on his behalf to a building or to premises in which there is a boiler or industrial plant, within the smoke control area, will be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £20. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed, the Order will not come into operation before the 1st October 1974 or before a later date determined by the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein, may be inspected free of charge at the offices of the Wath upon Dearne Urban District Council at the Town Hall, Wath upon Dearne, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 1st February 1974.

Within the said period, any person who will be affected by the Order, may by notice in writing to the Secretary of State for the Department of the Environment, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

SCHEDULE

The area of land within the Wath upon Dearne Urban District bounded by:

Barnsley Road (between its junction with Wet Moor Lane and West Street), West Street (between Barnsley
