A PROCLAMATION

ELIZABETH R.

MARGARET

Whereas Her Majesty, in pursuance of the Regency Acts 1937 to 1953, was pleased, by Letters Patent dated the 24th day of January 1974, to delegate to the six Counsellors of State therein named or any two or more of them full power and authority during the period of Her Majesty's absence from the United Kingdom to summon and hold on Her Majesty's behalf Her Privy Council, to approve and sign on Her Majesty's behalf any proclamation relating to the affairs of the United Kingdom, to do on Her Majesty's behalf anything required to be done in relation to any such proclamation, and further to do on Her Majesty's behalf anything which, by virtue of any statutory or other power, Her Majesty is authorised to do for the safety or good government of the United Kingdom:

And whereas by section 1 of the Emergency Powers Act 1920, as amended by the Emergency Powers Act 1964, it is enacted that if it appears to Her Majesty that there have occurred or are about to occur events of such a nature as to be calculated, by interfering with the supply and distribution of food, water, fuel or light, or with the means of locomotion, to deprive the community, or any substantial portion of the community, of the essentials of life, Her Majesty may, by proclamation, declare that a state of emergency exists:

And, whereas, on the 9th day of January, 1974, Her Majesty made, in pursuance of the said Act of 1920, as so

amended, a proclamation declaring that the industrial disputes affecting persons employed in the coal mines and on the railways and the reduction of oil supplies reaching Great Britain did, in Her Majesty's opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of that Act:

And whereas, by virtue of section 1 of the said Act of

And whereas, by virtue of section 1 of the said Act of 1920, a proclamation issued in pursuance thereof does not remain in force for more than one month:

And whereas the continuance of the said industrial disputes and the continued reduction in those oil supplies do, in Our opinion, constitute a state of emergency within the meaning of the said Act of 1920:

Now, therefore, We, Elizabeth The Queen Mother and Margaret, Countess of Snowdon, being authorised thereto by the said Letters Patent, in pursuance of the said Act of 1920, and by and with the advice of Her Majesty's Privy Council, do on Her Majesty's behalf hereby declare that a state of emergency exists.

Given at the Court of Saint James this seventh day of February in the year of our Lord nineteen hundred and seventy-four, and in the twenty-third year of Her Majesty's Reign.

Whereas the Secretary of State for the Environment, after giving to the Incumbent and Churchwardens of the Parish of Clifton with Glapton, Nottingham, ten day's previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act 1853 as amended by subsequent enactments, made a Representation to Her Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued forwith and entirely in St. Mary's Churchyard, Clifton, in the said Parish, shown hatched on the plan annexed herto.

Provided that-

- (a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stone-work or brickwork properly cemented.
- (b) In any earthern grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons


- heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.
- (c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, Her Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 10th day of April next.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish effected by such Representation one month before the said 10th day of April.

Whereas by the Burial Act 1855 (1855 c. 128) it was, amongst other things, enacted that it should be lawful for Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, from time to time to postpone the time appointed by any Order in Council for the discontinuance of burials, or otherwise to vary any Order in Council made under any of the Acts recited in the said Act, or under the said Act (whether the time thereby appointed for the discontinuance of burials thereunder, or other operation of such Order, should or should not have arrived), as to Her Majesty, with such advice as aforesaid, might seem fit:

And whereas an Order in Council was made on the 23rd day of April 1969, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") directing the discontinuance of burials, with exceptions, in St. Nicholas' Churchyard, Gosforth, in the County of Northumberland:

And whereas it seems fit to Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, that the principal Order should be varied:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice aforesaid, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The principal Order shall have effect subject to the following exception or qualification, viz.:--

That notwithstanding anything in the said Order the burial may be allowed in the said Churchyard of (a) the bodies of Mrs. Ada Elizabeth Redford and Mrs. Edith

Mary Wilson at their decease provided that no part of any coffins containing the said bodies shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave; and (b) the bodies of Mrs. Murial Farthing and Mr. David Clement Farthing in a single grave provided that the uppermost coffin containing the body is sealed with a layer of concrete over the top of the coffin to a depth of not less than three inches.

- 2. The Interpretation Act 1889 (1889, c. 63) shall apply to the interpretation of this Order as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.
- 3. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Nicholas' Churchyard, Gosforth, Northumberland) (Variation) Order 1974.



In any earthen grave now existing in the said part of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (St. Mary's Churchyard, Longnewton, County Durham) Order

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 3 (6), and 13 of the Import Duties Act 1958.

Viz.: The Import Duties (Temporary Reductions and Exemptions) Order 1974.

This Order provides for exemption from or reductions in import duties in the case of goods specified in the Schedules from 1st January 1974 to 31st December 1974 or in the case of goods in Schedule 1 to the earlier dates there specified.

There is exemption from import duties in the case of all goods in Schedules 1 and 2 if the goods satisfy the requisite conditions to benefit from the eventual abolition of customs duties in trade between Member States of the European Communities.

In the case of other goods, where a rate of duty is specified in column 3 of Schedule 1 or 3, duty is reduced to that rate instead of any higher rate which would otherwise apply and where "free" appears in column 3 in relation to the goods, they are exempt from duty whatever their origin.

In the case of goods originating in Egypt or Cyprus greater reductions in duty are available than those referred to above in a number of cases, such reductions being shown respectively in column 4 and 5 of Schedule 1 or 3.

Goods in the case of which reductions are specified in Schedule 3 have hitherto been subject to lesser reductions in duty under the Import Duties (Reductions and Exemptions) (No. 2) Order 1973, which is amended accordingly. (They remain exempt from duty by virtue of that Order if they satisfy the requisite conditions to benefit from the eventual abolition of customs duties in trade between Member States of the Communities.)

The Order comes into operation on 8th February and has been published as a Statutory Instrument 1974.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections

1 (6) (b) of the Finance Act 1973.

Viz.: The Customs Duties and Drawbacks (Revenue Duties) (Morocco) Order 1974.

This Order, which comes into effect on 1st March 1974, implements the obligations of the United Kingdom under the agreement of 2nd March 1973, between the enlarged E.E.C. and Morocco. It provides for the reduction of the protective elements in the customs revenue duties on certain goods to the rates applicable to imports from E.E.C. countries. The goods are certain spirits, beer, vermouth, manufactured tobacco, matches and mechanical lighters.

The Order also revokes, for all revenue duty goods, other than hydrocarbon oils, originating in Morocco, the arrangements introduced in the Customs Duties and Drawbacks (Revenue, including Hydrocarbon Oil, Duties) (Miscellaneous Amendments) Order 1973 (S.I. 1973/2085), under which increases in duties were suspended pending the entry into force of this agreement. The effect of this is to apply the full rates of duty, imposed by the Customs Duties and Drawbacks (Revenue Duties) Order 1973 (S.I. 1973/1946), to fermented beverages (other than wine), certain industrial spirits obtained from agricultural products, wine lees and spirits obtained from agricultural products, wine lees and unmanufactured tobacco.

The Order provides for like adjustments in the drawback rates where applicable.

The Order comes into operation on 1st March 1974 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1974 No. 143.
