Trunk Road (The Highway and Glynne Way, warden) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Hawarden\ and Restriction of Waiting) (Amendment) Order 1974.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales intends to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to amend the Trunk Road (The Highway and Glynne Way, Hawarden) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1071

The principal changes are as follows:

(i) instead of vehicles being prohibited from waiting between 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. on the south side of Glynne Way from a point 40 yards south-east of its junction with Rectory Lane to a point 140 yards south-east of that junction, vehicles will be allowed to wait during the said hours, for a maximum period of 15 minutes in any one hour.

(ii) a loading and unloading prohibition with an exception for vehicles used for postal purposes will apply to the north side of the length of Glynne Way specifield in (i) above, during the hours of 7 a.m. and 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. and 6 p.m.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to allow invalid vehicles and vehicles bearing a disabled person's badge to wait for so long as may be necessary on the side of road specified in (i) above.

(d) specifies, in respect of metered parking places, that passenger vehicles (12 seats or less), goods carrying vehicles, motor cycles and invalid carriages may be left therein and in respect of residents' parking places, that vehicles displaying a valid parking card bearing the letter "B" issued by the City Council may be left therein;

(e) provides that parking cards and protective covers will be issued by the City Council on application being made by any person residing in the streets or parts of streets listed in Schedule 3 to this Notice or in any other street within a controlled parking zone in the City to which the provisions of the City of Westminster (Parking Places) Order 1968 apply who is the owner of a passenger vehicle (12 seats or less), a goods carrying vehicle not more than 8 feet in height, a motor cycle or an invalid carriage;

(f) specifies that:

(i) in the metered parking places, the initial charge is at the rate of 2½ new pence for a period of thirty minutes plus

any unexpired time shown on the parking meter provided that the maximum initial period does not exceed 2 hours;

If the vehicle displays a valid permit combined with a valid season ticket (also heretofore referred to as a parking card) no such charge is payable;
