Chailey Rural District (Peacehaven) Public Path Diversion Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order"), made on the 22nd February 1974 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Chailey Rural District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order if confirmed without modification will be to:

- (a) divert a 150 metres length of public footpaths 11b/11a Peacehaven, running from a point opposite the junction of Hodder Avenue with Balcombe Road and terminating approximately 37 metres to the south of 116 Sutton Avenue so as to follow a line easterly along the proposed Balcombe Road and then north-easterly up Sutton Avenue;
- (b) divert a 45 metres length of public footpath 14 Peacehaven from a point at the junction of the proposed Balcombe Road with Sutton Avenue and terminating where it joins footpaths 11a/11b approximately 52 metres to the south of 117 Rowe Avenue so as to follow a line westerly along the proposed Balcombe Road and then north-easterly up Rowe Avenue.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at Lewes House, High Street, Lewes, during normal hours of business.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Clerk of the Chailey Rural District Council, Lewes House, High Street, Lewes, not later than the 4th April 1974 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Chailey Rural District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
