

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert part of the public right of way running in a south-easterly direction from a point on the B.2088 road about 157 yards west of the Post Office at Four Oaks in the parish of Beckley so that it runs from a point on that road about 10 yards further west.

This Order becomes operative as from 15th March 1974, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he may under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971, within 6 weeks from the 15th March 1974, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT, 1971—SECTION 210
The Beaconsfield (Odds Farm, Wooburn Common) Public Path Diversion Order 1973

Notice is hereby given that on the 12th March 1974 the Beaconsfield Urban District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Description of site of existing path or way near Odds Farm in the Urban District of Beaconsfield in the County of Buckingham.

That part of a footpath leading from Wooburn Common Road eastwards from the point where the accessway known as Salters Row, Wooburn Common, terminates at its eastern end and running in an easterly direction along the northern side of a well-established hedge for a distance of approximately 600 feet and as indicated by the points "A" and "B" on the map attached to the Order.

SECOND SCHEDULE

Description of site of alternative highway near Odds Farm in the Urban District of Beaconsfield in the County of Buckingham.

The alternative highway will proceed in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 45 feet from the said point marked "A" to point "C" on the said map and then in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 480 feet approximately parallel with the existing public footpath to point "D" on the said map and then south-easterly for a distance of approximately 30 feet to the said point "B".
