Length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48)

That length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A.48) at Pyle in the County of Glamorgan which extends from a point 20 yards east of its junction with the Porthcawl to Margam Class II Road (B.4283) in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 220 yards.

The Trunk Road (Betws-y-Coed) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be:

- (a) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice; and
- (b) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice during the period between 1st May and 30th September in any year.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein; to enable the vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage situated on or adjacent to any of the said sides of road; or to enable the vehicle to be used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with a plan and statement of reasons for the Order, may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of the Betws-y-Coed Urban District Council, Council Offices, Betws-y-Coed, Caernarvonshire.

Objections to the proposed Order should be sent to the Secretary of State, Welsh Office, Roads Division (Y Swyddfa Gymreig, Adran Ffyrdd) 139 Newport Road, Cardiff, CF2 1YU, by 11th April 1974 quoting the reference number R15/225/10, and stating the grounds of objection.

SCHEDULE 1

Sides of the London-Holyhead Trunk Road (A.5) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road") at Betws-y-Coed in the County of Caernarvon.

1. The south-east side of that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 250 yards west of its junction with Route B.5106 at Pont-y-Pair to a point 190 yards west of that junction.
2. The south side of that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 65 yards north-west of its junction with the road leading to the Railway Station to a point 40 yards south of its junction with the Class III road leading to St. Michael's Church.
3. The east side of that length of the trunk road, which extends from a point 40 yards south of its junction with the Class III road leading to St. Michael's Church to the milestone 60 yards south of the railway bridge.

SCHEDULE 2

Sides of the London-Holyhead Trunk Road (A.5) (hereinafter referred to as "the trunk road") at Betws-y-Coed in the County of Caernarvon.

1. The south-west side of that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 83 yards south-east of its junction with Route B.5106 to a point 65 yards north-west of its junction with the road leading to the Railway Station.
2. The west side of that length of the trunk road which extends from a point 40 yards south of its junction with the Class III road leading to St. Michael's Church to the milestone 60 yards south of the railway bridge.
