The Trunk Road (Northern Avenue, Cardiff) (Prohibition of Left-Hand Turn) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be to prohibit the making of a left-hand turn from that length of the Cardiff—Llangurig Trunk Road (A.470) known as Northern Avenue, in the County Borough of Cardiff into Roundabout Garage.

The Trunk Road (Old Concrete Road, Mold) (Prohibition of Right-Hand Turn) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which will be that no person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in a north-westerly direction in that length of the Dolgellau—Bala—Ruthin—Queensferry—South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A.494), known as Old Concrete Road, at Mold in the county of Flint, to make a right-hand turn into St. David's Lane.

The Trunk Road (Troedyrhiw, Merthyr Tydfil) (Prohibition of Entry) Order 1974

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, the effect of which is that no person shall cause any vehicle proceeding in that length of the Cardiff—Glan Conway Trunk Road (A.470), at Troedyrhiw, Merthyr Tydfil, Glamorgan, to enter that road known as Wyndham Street.

The alternative route for southbound traffic is to turn right at Troedyrhiw Square into the B.4285 and then left into Wyndham Street.

The Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (Rhiw Bridge Diversion) Order 197

and

The Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road (Rhiw Bridge Diversion Side Roads) Order 197

The Secretary of State for Wales gives notice that he proposes to make the following Orders:

- an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing:
 - (a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Rhiw Bridge, near Berriew in the county of Montgomery, shall become a trunk road (hereinafter called "the new trunk road") as from the date when the Order comes into operation, and
 - (b) that the short length of the Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road to be superseded by the construction of the new trunk road at its junction with the side road leading to Berriew shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by him to the County Council of Montgomery (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic, and
- an Order under section 9 of the Highways Act 1959 authorising him:
 - (a) to improve, raise, lower or otherwise alter a highway,

(b) to stop up parts of the superseded Trunk Road and part of Cart Road Footway No. 122 from its junction with the Trunk Road,

(c) to construct new highways, to connect Cart Road Footway No. 122 and the unclassified road to Berriew

with the new trunk road,

(d) to stop up private means of access to the premises, known as Glansevern Hall, Glansevern Lodge, Pen-y-Geulan and Dollas, and

(e) to provide a new means of access to the premises known as Glansevern Hall, Pen-y-Geulan and Dollas from the new trunk road,

all at Rhiw Bridge aforesaid, and providing for the transfer of each of the said new highways to the County Council of Montgomery as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highways have been completed and are open for through traffic.
