TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday the 29th March 1974, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, and the National Loans Act, 1968, to the amount of £140,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000 or £250,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday the 1st April 1974, to Friday the 5th April 1974, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one new half-penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

HIGHWAYS ACTS 1959 TO 1971

The Fishguard—Bangor (Menai Suspension Bridge) Trunk Road (Feidrfair and Other Streets, Cardigan) Order 1974

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 7 of the Highways Act 1959 providing that Feidrfair, Cardigan, and Priory Street, Cardigan, from its junction with Morgan Street to its junction with Feidrfair shall become trunk roads and that Priory Street, Cardigan, from its junction with High Street to its junction with Morgan Street shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date when this Order comes into operation.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Cathays Park, Cardiff, and at the offices of Cardigan County Council (Highways Department) County Hall, Aberaeron, where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959 or the Highways Act 1971 or on the ground that any requirement of either of those Acts, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within six weeks from 26th March 1974 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
