SCHEDULE 1

That length of the Dolgellau—Bala—Ruthin—Queensferry—South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A.494), at Bala in the County of Merioneth which extends from a point 27 yards south-west of its junction with Ffrydan Road (A.4212) to a point 89 yards north-east of that junction.

SCHEDULE 2

Sides of the Dolgellau—Bala—Ruthin—Queensferry—South of Birkenhead Trunk Road (A.494) (hereinafter referred to as "the Trunk Road") at Bala in the County of Merioneth.

1. The north-west side of that length of the trunk road, known as Station Road, which extends from a point 26 yards south-west of its junction with Ffrydan Road (A.4212) to a point 123 yards south-west of that junction.

2. The north-west side of that length of the trunk road, known as High Street, which extends from a point 167 yards south-west of its junction with Ffrydan Road (A.4212) to a point 229 yards south-west of that junction.

3. The south-east side of that length of the trunk road, known in part as Station Road and in part as High Street, which extends from a point 26 yards south-west of its junction with Ffrydan Road (A.4212) to a point 183 yards south-west of that junction.
