of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral;

(e) if the vehicle is in the service of or employed by the Post Office and is waiting while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to these lengths of road are being unloaded from the vehicle, or, having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered or while postal packets are being collected from premises or posting boxes adjacent to such lengths of road or is in use in connection with the servicing of telephone kiosks adjacent to those lengths of road;

(f) if the vehicle is a vehicle used for fire brigade purposes or ambulance, or any vehicle in the service of a local authority or police force in either case being used in pursuance of statutory powers or duties.

5. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road referred to in Schedule 2 to this Order:

if there is displayed on the vehicle in a conspicuous position a certificate issued by the Council granting exemption from the restrictions contained in Article 2 of this Order.

- 6. Nothing in Article 2 of this Order shall render it unlawful to cause or permit any vehicle to wait in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road referred to in Schedule 2 of this Order:
  - (1) if the vehicle is a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations, 1971 or a badge having effect under those regulations as if it were a disabled persons badge;

(2) for so long as may be necessary to enable a medical practitioner or person engaged in ancillary medical

or welfare services to carry out his duties in connection with a person residing in premises the postal address of which is in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order;

(3) for the purpose of loading or unloading the vehicle while the vehicle is in actual use in connection with the removal of furniture from one office or dwellinghouse to another or the removal of furniture from such premises to a depository or to such premises from a depository;

(4) for so long as may be necessary to enable the vehicle, if it cannot conveniently be used for such purposes in any other road, to be used in connection with cleaning windows or chimneys, repair or service of any domestic appliance and building, repair and re-decoration in premises the postal address of which is in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of road specified in Schedule 2 to this Order;

(5) if the vehicle is owned by a funeral director or owner of funeral vehicles when in use as part of a funeral cortege or otherwise in connection with a funeral:

(6) for so long as may be necessary if the vehicle cannot conveniently be used for such purpose in any other road in connection with a wedding; and

- (7) for so long as may be necessary to enable goods to be sold from the vehicle provided that such goods are immediately delivered at or taken into premises adjacent to the vehicle from which sale is effected.
- 7. In addition to the exceptions provided in Article 4 of this Order nothing in Article 3 shall apply to a disabled persons vehicle which displays in the relevant position a disabled persons badge issued by any Local Authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1971 or a badge having effect under those regulations as if it were a disabled persons badge.

8. In Articles 6 (1) and 7 "relevant position" means:

- (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front wind-screen, the badge is exhibited thereon with the obverse side facing forwards on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen;
- (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windon the vehicle.

9. The City and County Borough of Cardiff (King George V Drive East) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1972 and (King George V Drive West) (Prohibition of Waiting)

Order 1971 are hereby revoked.

10. The restrictions imposed by this Order shall be in addition to and not in derogation of any restrictions or requirement imposed by any regulations made or having effect as if made under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended as aforesaid or by or under any other enactment.

11. The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament, and as if for the purposes of section 38 of that Act this Order were an Act of Parliament and the Orders revoked by Article 9 of this Order were Acts of Parliament thereby repealed.

12. This Order shall come into operation on the 4th day of May 1974 and may be cited as the County Council of South Glamorgan (Heath Area) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1974.

#### PART I

1. This Order shall come into operation on the 4th May 1974, and may be cited as the County Council of South Glamorgan (Street Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1974.

2. (1) In this Order, except where the context otherwise requires, the following expressions have the meanings hereby respectively assigned to them:—
"driver", in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking space, means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left

in the parking place;
parking place "means any part of a road authorised by this Order to be used as a parking place.

(2) The Interpretation Act 1889 shall apply for the interpretation of this Order as it applies for the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

#### PART II

Authorisation and use of parking places

3. The part of each road specified in column 1 of the Schedule to this Order is authorised to be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such vehicles or classes of vehicles, in such position and on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that part in the said Schedule.

4. Nothing in Article 3 of this Order-

(a) shall restrict the power of the Council, for preventing obstruction of the streets, by order on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination, or where the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed to close any parking place; or

(b) shall authorise the use of any part of a road so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the

road, or the use of the road by any person entitled to the use thereof, or so as to be a nuisance.

5. Where in the Schedule to this Order a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place—

(a) unless it is of the specified class; or (b) in a position other than that specified.

6. A driver of a vehicle shall not use a parking place-

(a) so as unreasonably to prevent access to any premises adjoining the road, or the use of the road by other persons,

or so as to be a nuisance;

(b) when for preventing obstruction of the streets the Council shall by Order made on the occasion of any public procession, rejoicing or illumination or when the streets are thronged or liable to be obstructed have closed that parking place and exhibited notice of such closing on or near the parking place.

7. The driver of a motor-vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place, and shall not start the engine except when about to change position of the vehicle in or to depart from the

parking place.

8. No person shall use a vehicle, while it is in a parking place, in connection with the sale of any article to persons in or near the parking place or in connection with the selling or offering for hire of his skill or services.

9. Subject to the proviso hereto, when a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions contained in Article 5 or Article 6 of this Order a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may remove the vehicle or arrange for it to be moved from that parking place. Provided that when a vehicle is waiting in a parking place in contravention of the provisions of Article 5(b) of this Order, a person authorised in that behalf by the Council may alter or cause to be altered the position of the probicle in order that its position shall comply with that provision.

10. Any person removing a vehicle or altering its position by virtue of the last preceding Article of this Order may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think necessary and may take such measures in relation to
