Diversion of Part of Right of Way No. 104 at Chilmead Farm, Nutfield

Notice of Public Path Diversion Order (No. 5) 1974

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on the 16th May 1974 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Surrey County Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert that part of public right of way No. 104 running from a point approximately 547 yards west of Cormongers Lane in an easterly direction to a point on Cormongers Lane. The diverted footpath will run north-east to Cormongers Lane and then south to join the existing footpath at a point approximately 179 feet north of Chilmead Farm, Nutfield. (The existing footpath is shown by a bold black line and the diverted route is shown by an interrupted black line on the plan referred to in the Order).

Public Path Diversion Order, 1974*

Notice is hereby given that on 16th May 1974 the Warwickshire County Council confirmed the above-named Order as an unopposed Order.
