Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order, made on 26th April 1974, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, or to be confirmed, as an unopposed Order, by the Gravesham Borough Council.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modifications, will be to divert the public right of way

(a) commencing at a point in Oakenden Road approximately 216 yards west of Luddesdown Village Hall in the Parish of Luddesdown in the County of Kent and thence running in a south-easterly direction for a distance of 192 yards (Footpath No. 241) and

(b) commencing at a point approximately 75 yards west of Luddesdown Court in the Parish of Luddesdown in the County of Kent and thence running in an easterly direction for a distance of 116 yards (Footpath No. 227)

to a line

(a) commencing at a point in Oakenden Road approximately 216 yards west of Luddesdown Village Hall in the Parish of Luddesdown in the County of Kent and thence running in a southerly direction for a distance of 77 yards in a south-easterly direction for 40 yards and a southerly direction for 67 yards

(b) commencing at a point approximately 80 yards north-west of Luddesdown Court in the Parish of Luddesdown in the County of Kent and thence running in a north-easterly direction for a distance of 203 yards to the junction of Luddesdown Road and Oakenden Road.
