NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

- (1) *West Sussex County Council (Ford) Public Path (No. 364/2) Extinguishment Order 1972*
- (2) *West Sussex County Council (Ford) Public Path (No. 365) Extinguishment Order 1972*

Notice is hereby given that on 26th April 1974, the West Sussex County Council confirmed the above-named Orders. The effect of the Orders as confirmed is to:

- (1) extinguish the public footpath (Path No. 364/2), in the Parish of Ford, commencing at its junction with Ford Road at the public footpath (Path No. 364/1), at a point approximately 350 feet east of New House Farm, extending southwards for a distance of approximately 250 feet to its junction with public footpath (Path No. 200/2).
- (2) extinguish part of the public footpath (Path No. 365), in the Parish of Ford, commencing at a point approximately 370 feet north-east of Place Farm, extending westwards for a distance of approximately 550 feet.

Copies of the Orders as confirmed and the maps contained in them have been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the office of the County Secretary, County Hall, Chichester, and at the office of the Secretary and Solicitor, Arun District Council, Council Offices, Littlehampton, between 10 a.m. and 5 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The Orders become operative as from 7th June 1974, but if a person aggrieved by the Orders desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Orders he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 2 to the Act as applied by paragraph 5 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within 6 weeks from 17th May 1974 make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

TONBRIDGE AND MALLING DISTRICT COUNCIL

Rural District Council of Malling (Footpaths Nos. 408 and 410 (Parts) Ightham) Public Paths Diversion Order 1974.

Notice is hereby given that on 1st May 1974, Tonbridge and Malling District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the part of footpath No. 410 commencing at the north-western corner of Trycewell Market Garden in the Parish of Ightham and leading in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 81 metres, to a line commencing at and leaving the existing path at the north-western corner of Trycewell Market Garden and leading in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 62 metres and thence in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 43 metres to rejoin the existing footpath, and to divert that part of footpath No. 408 running from a point in the north-eastern corner of Trycewell Market Garden to the point of diversion of footpath No. 410 at a point approximately 61 metres therefrom to the south-west, to a line commencing at and running from a point in the north-eastern corner of Trycewell Market Garden and terminating at a point approximately 33 metres therefrom in a westerly direction where a junction will be formed with the diverted part of footpath No. 410 described above.

The Order becomes operative as from 18th May 1974, but if a person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1959, as amended, or on the ground that any requirements of the Act, as amended, or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in

relation to the Order he may, under paragraph 2 of Schedule 7 to the Act, within six weeks from 18th May 1974, make an application for the purpose to the High Court.

SEA FISHERIES (SHELLFISH) ACT 1967

The Emsworth Channel Fishery Order

Notice is hereby given that the Emsworth Harbour Fishermen's Federation Limited have applied to the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food for an Order under the Sea Fisheries (Shellfish) Act 1967 conferring upon them a right of several fishery for oysters, mussels and clams over an area in the Emsworth Channel in the counties of Hampshire and West Sussex containing about 236 acres.
