and the fime Day the Empress Dowager, accompanied by her Daughters the Arch-Dutchesses, celebrated the Anniverlary of the late Emprels in the Church of the Jesuits. They write from Hungary; that the Colonel of the Heydukes in the Garrison of Neuhausel, having represented to the Governor of that Town the Missery of the Soldiers for want of Mony and Cloaths, and reproaching him with the Breach of his Promile, in not providing Necessaries for the Garrison; the Governor was so incenfed at these Reproaches, that they both drew their Scymerans, and would have fought upon the Spot, had they not been prevented by some Officers who were present. Hereupon the Heydukes immediately raised a Tumult, and the Governor forthwith commanded the Infantry and Cavalry of the Garrifor, to fland to their Aims, in order to appeale or dilplife They add, that those Commotions them. were not quieted at the Dispatch of these Advices, and it was expeded that the Confequer co would be advantageous to the Imperialiffs. We have received a particular Account of the taking of Leiffchau by General Heister, whereby it appears that the General having invested the Place, sommoned the Malecontents to f rrender; bur, upon their Refulal, he gave Ordees for bombarding the Town; and having burnt down about two hundred Houses, the Governor sent him a Request to desist from throwing any more Bembs 'till next Day, during which time he promifed to dispose the Town to surrender. This being granted, the Enemy employed all the Night in uncovering their Houses, and prepared for a further Defence, instead of a Capitulation; and next Day fignified to the General, That they would defind the Place to the last Extremity, and thereupon made a vigorous Sally on the Berfiegers; but they were warmly repulsed, and one Lieutenart and one Ensign were taken Prisoners. The Imperialists immediately hanged up the Lieuremant before the Gate of the Town, short the Ensign to Death, and thereupon made the General Assult, and carried the Place Sword in Hard. Most of the Malecontents were put to the Sword, and a strong Garrison left in the Town by the Imperialists.
