Description of the Land comprised in the Application

A piece of land comprising 2,040 acres or thereabouts situated approximately 2½ miles to the North-North-East of the Township of Morpeth with the Western boundary adjacent to the Village of Hebron and the South-East boundary adjacent to the Village of Longhirst. The classified road C.130 borders the South-West and Southern boundary. A strip of land passes under the classified road B.1337 which borders the South-East and Eastern boundary of the land extending eastwards over the classified road C.124 and over the main London to Edinburgh railway, to a disposal area East of the said railway and 1 mile to the West-South-West of Linton Colliery bounded to the South by the disused Longhirst Drift Mineral Railway.
